BACKGROUND

- Senate Bill 34, adding sections 1798.90.5-1798.90.55 to the California Civil Code became effective January 1, 2016 imposing duties on Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) operators and end users.
- Parking owns two automated license plate recognition units for enforcing time limits.

POLICY

• The proposed policy documents a formal process for the collection, use, maintenance, sharing and dissemination of Automated License Plate Recognition information in compliance with SB 34.

RECOMMENDATION

 It is recommended by the Finance Department that the Council, by resolution, adopt a privacy and usage policy to comply with Senate Bill 34, Collection of License Plate Information.
