Efficient governments use data


Until recently, governments made decisions largely based on instinct and rhetoric. They lacked the time and resources needed to fully review the outcomes of various programs.



Open Data & Open Performance

A difference in intentions

Open Performance

- Data already analyzed and formatted specifically for your pre-defined measures
- Not as useful for answering questions beyond the predefined metrics
- You are putting your own "lens" on the data and telling a story

Objective

Show trends and progress against your pre-defined performance goals



Open Data

- · Raw, incident-level data
- Pulled directly from system of record
- Not pre-aggregated or preanalyzed
- · Easy to filter or roll-up
- Allow the user to tell their own story



Objective

Allow the user to draw their own insights from the data



Guiding Principals (ICMA Performance Management)


Performance Measures should be...

- Aligned with City Council and General Plan mission, goals, priorities.
- Results focused: strategies, processes, and decisions are designed to achieve desired results.
- Relevant: Matters to both the city government and the community.
- Transparent: Easy for stakeholders to access and understand.
- Timely, accurate, and pertinent: Data drives decisions and processes.
- Transformative: Continuously improves the organization, management decisions, and policy-making processes.
- Sustainable over time and across organizational changes.



Performance Goals Roadmap

- Establish draft Measures and Goals.
- Catalog, collect and verify the data.
- Build a narrative.
- Test and Review with subject matter experts and stakeholders.



- Refine Measures and finalize Goals.
- Establish Performance Measures based on Outcomes.

Welcome to the City of Santa Rosa Performance Dashboard

The City of Santa Rosa Performance Dashboard was developed as a way for the city and its residents to monitor the city's progress toward Council and Department goals online. The dashboard is organized around City Departments, each of which has several topic areas pertaining to the goal.

Clicking on a tile for each topic area will allow you to delve further into the strategic objectives underway in that area and the metrics that are being used to monitor it. The City of Santa Rosa dashboard is powered by the city's Open Data portal (data.srcity.org), which allows users to drill down into the individual or aggregate data.
