RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Finance Department that the City Council hold a Study Session to provide an opportunity for the City Council to receive information and ask questions relative to each department, the Capital Improvement Program, and the Community Promotion funding requests for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18. No action is necessary.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is the second of two budget Study Sessions where the City Council will be presented with an overview of the funding requests for FY 2017-18. These Study Sessions are held in advance of the Budget Hearings in June to allow the City Council ask questions, provide direction, and gain a full understanding of the funding requests that will be before them for formal adoption in June.

BACKGROUND

The City's budget process began in January as departments began to develop their budget requests. The City held a public hearing on January 24, 2017, to solicit input from the community on items to be considered in the budget. The City Council had its first goal setting meeting on March 10, 2017 and met again on April 20th and 21st to finalize the goals. To the extent possible, this budget was developed with those goals and the community input in mind. The FY 2017-18 proposed budget has been reviewed by the Chief Financial Officer and the City Manager and is now ready to be presented to the City Council.

ANALYSIS

This is part two of a two-part Study Session.
