




- Current Approved Medical Cannabis accounts for 2.7% of Industrial space
- An additional 4.5% of space is being reviewed.
- Current Industrial vacancy rate is 5%
- 16 approved medical cannabis land use permits (2 currently in operation)
- 19 pending medical cannabis preapplications or applications submitted






Permitting and Vacancy Rate











Methods to Address Increase in Cannabis Business Activity

Market Forces

- Pros:
 - allows the market to adjust as industry evolves
 - Changes in laws and permitting in other cities/counties could provide relief to the demand over time
- Cons:
 - Unpredictable
 - Dramatic increase in price affecting other industries and available space
 - Potential bubble as industry dramatically changes



Methods to Address Increase in Cannabis Business Activity

Regulatory Control

- Pros:
 - Provides a clear limit on industry
 - Potential to limit the displacement of other businesses
- Cons:
 - Unknown impact to prices and market if limit was imposed

Licensing and operation of medical cannabis distributors, transporters, testing laboratories and dispensaries

Highlights:

- Definition of ownership
- Priority application processing
- Definition of premises
- Continued operation during application review
- Hours of operation for dispensaries
- Delivery content restrictions



CA Department of Food and Agriculture

Regulation oversight:

Licensing and operation of medical cannabis cultivation and track and trace

Highlights:

- Application requirements
- New Processor license
- Definition of canopy
- Multi-tenant cultivation allowance
- Environmental protections and requirements
- Delivery content restrictions
- Track and trace information



CA Department of Public Health

Regulation oversight:

Licensing and operation of medical cannabis manufacturing

Highlights:

- New license Types Type P and Type N
- Clarification of Type 6 and Type 7 allowances
- License Constraints
- Application requirements
- Continued operation during application review
- Permissible extraction methods
- THC caps, Uniform distribution and prohibited products
- Labeling restrictions



Governor Budget Trailer Bill

Proposed repeal of the Medical Cannabis Regulatory and Safety Act (MCRSA) and conforming revisions to the Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA).

If it passes, the draft regulations will be repealed and new regulations will be issued on an emergency basis , likely in August.

Any comments received by the State Agencies, will be incorporated into the final regulations in either case.
