RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Finance, Transportation & Public Works (TPW) and Water Departments that the Council, by resolution, approve two General Services Agreements for Asphalt Concrete: one to Bodean Co., Inc., Santa Rosa, California, in the total amount not to exceed \$763,189; and, one to Syar Industries, Inc., Napa, California, in the total amount not to exceed \$765,392.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This contract will provide a fixed price for asphalt concrete products.

BACKGROUND

On March 30, 2017, Invitation for Bids (IFB) 17-20, solicited by the City for the purchase of asphalt concrete supplies were opened by the Purchasing Agent. Asphalt concrete supplies, including various types of hot and cold asphalt concrete mix, are used by the Transportation and Public Works and Santa Rosa Water Departments and is picked up at the plants by City staff.

The departments requested two vendors be awarded contracts. This will assure availability of product during the summer construction months when asphalt is in high demand. Each contract is for a one-year period with four (4) one-year extension options.

PRIOR CITY COUNCIL REVIEW

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ANALYSIS

Of the four vendors notified of this solicitation, two responses were received, both were considered responsive and responsible to the bid requirements.
