### RECOMMENDATION

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this study session is to provide information regarding the impacts of the October wildfires on the Department of Housing and Community Services programs, as well as a review of the recovery activities undertaken by the Department.

### **BACKGROUND**

October 8, 2017 marked the beginning of the Sonoma Complex Fires. A Presidential Disaster declaration was issued on October 10, 2017. Relative to the scope of the disaster, the impact to Housing Authority programs was minimal. Thirty-two units subsidized under the Housing Choice Voucher program were destroyed or are otherwise uninhabitable. Three mobile home units with rehabilitation loans funded through programs administered by the Santa Rosa Housing Trust were destroyed or damaged. Four homes funded in part by Housing Authority silent second loans were destroyed in the fire. The Santa Rosa Housing Authority has requested regulatory relief under the Housing Choice Voucher program. The Department of Housing and Community services has requested a waiver of Community Planning and Development (CPD) Grant Program and Consolidated Plan requirements to allow program flexibility as the City moves towards recovery.
