GENERAL ITEMS

OBSERVATION NOTES:

- 1 Per plans all trees marked for removal are not onsite, they have been removed
- 2 Only two trees marked as "SAVE" on the legend are missing (10 & 21)
- 3 Canopy edges of all trees had silt fencing and orange snow fence installed or in progress
- 4 Live Oak 10 has a stump left with overgrown greenery & vines covering it
- 5 M. Pine location is just weeds, no visable sign of the pine ever being there, no stump
- 6 Neighbors claim that the Oak tree fell into their yard and paid \$2,000 to have it removed

Trees 11 & 16 Umbellaria have two main trunks and other new growth at the base. In the middle of this growth is the stump of Tree 10, the missing Live Oak which shows evidence of being cut and removed approximately two years ago (see picture below)




Tree stump 10 This stump is the remainder of tree 10. The cut is approximately two plus seasons old. The neighbors claimed that they had to pay \$2,000 to have it removed after it fell on their property. The new developers paid the neighbors the \$2K to make sure that things go smoothly with adjacent property.

To the right in the picture also on the neighbors side of the fence is Tree 27,
Fremontii in good health



Tree 14 & 15 Live Oaks located along the fence next to the Doug fir tree. This is the location where a large 24" caliper M. Pine is suppose to be. No evidence that this tree existed for some time. It must have been removed in the past as well.




Tree 21

Tree 18 Live Oak in the front yard outside of the wood fencing is in good health. Plans call out Tree 19 as a Cypress to be removed however the tree existing in the front we list as tree 17 and is a Magnolia in good health. Plans are to save this tree. (see right edge of picture)
