Public Input and Voting Outcomes

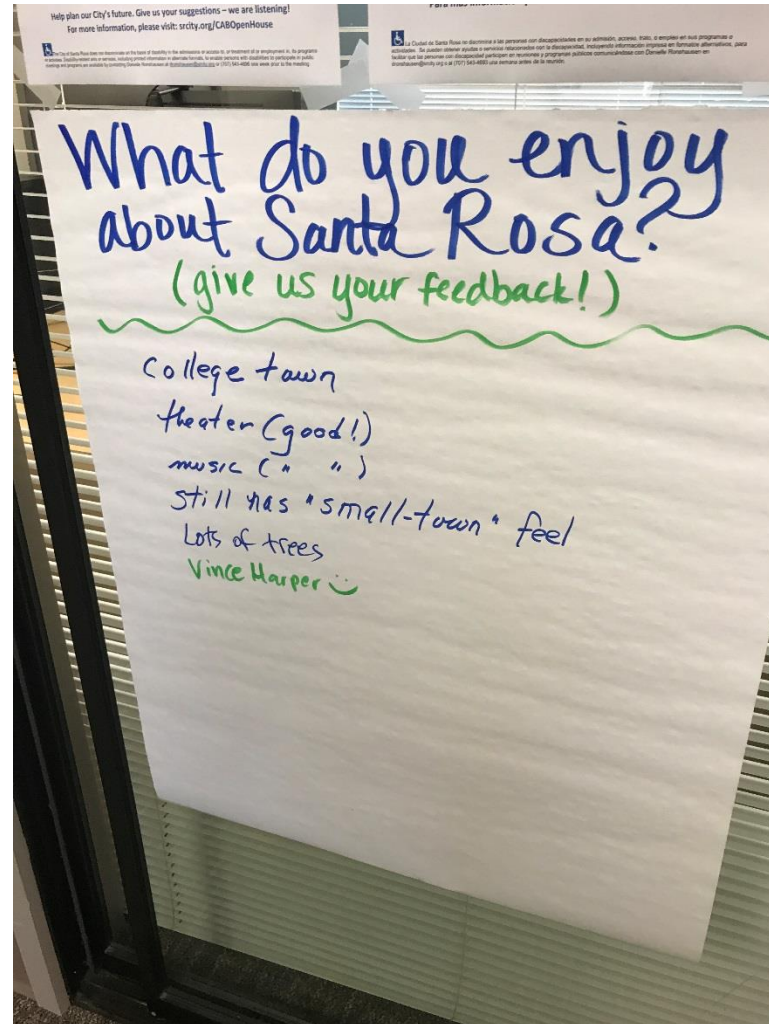
- Priority Areas of Concern:

Recommendations for Improvement

- Continue with open house format
- Utilize social media (particularly Nextdoor) and email distribution for outreach
- Use already existing events and meetings (e.g. Wednesday Night Market) to gather feedback

Community Improvement Grant Program

CAB's Responsibilities: Community Improvement Grants

Resolution #28686:

“...oversee the issuance of a public grant application solicitation in May and acceptance of applications in July. The Board, in a noticed public meeting during the months of August and September, shall review all grant applications submitted.”

Background

- No “new” funds allocated since FY 2007-08
- As of 2016, all funding in one account – no longer separate CAB district accounts
- In FY 2016-17, the CAB selected 14 projects for funding, totaling \$13,152 (max grant amount was \$1,000).
- In FY 2017-18, the CAB decided to increase project funding maximum to \$5,000 per project

FY 17-18 CIG Details

- 48 applications received
- Significant increase in applicants with the increased maximum grant amount of \$5,000
- \$180,237 in requested funds
- 9 projects chosen, totaling \$31, 483.38
- Funds available for grants now exhausted

Recommendations for Improvement

- Align grant cycle with annual budget process for FY 2019-2020
- Application process clarified to identify and eliminate non-qualifying grants from CAB consideration (required update to Resolution #28686)
- Refine eligibility standards and requirements for grant applicants.
