### Current Overview of Temporary Housing Data

- Currently, 3,243 applicants completed the Pre-Placement Interview (PPI) Process
- There have only been 84 applicants eligible for FEMA temporary housing (added to the PPI queue) over the last month (between 12/4/17 & 1/2/18)
- 189 applicants out of the 3,243 PPI process indicated needing a FEMA temporary housing solution
- Current percentage of applicants requiring housing is 5.8% out of the 3,243 which is below the historical average of 10% needing a federal housing solution





### Current Pre-Placement Interview (PPI) Data

- 3243 applicants eligible for consideration of FEMA housing solution
  - 2474 applicants found their own solution and do not need FEMA assistance
  - 580 applicants have not answered numerous call attempts
  - 189 requested a FEMA housing solution
- Actions to provide confidence in numbers:
  - The IA housing team called applicants in other categories to verify need:
  - Already housed called 30 applicants
  - Will find a housing solution called 20 applicants
  - Results: 1 person asked for a FEMA housing solution.

#### **Current Temporary Housing Mission**

- FEMA will build capacity to required need based on data
- Current Data:
  - 135 Applicants Housed
  - 54 Applicants Requiring Housing
- Projected Capacity Needed 217 (6% of 3613)





#### **Current Temporary Housing Mission Sites**

- Sonoma County Fairgrounds Expansion (Old Ballfield)
  - 50 Pads (Underdevelopment)
- Sonoma County Fairgrounds :
  - 120 Leased Pads (82 Applicants Housed)
- Direct Lease Apartments:
  - 53 Applicants Housed
- Private Site Development:
  - 8 Identified and actively evaluating each site feasibility by the FEMA Housing Team
