Background

- Water Enterprise
 - Funded by Fees and Rates
- Wastewater Enterprise
 - Funded by Fees and Rates
- Subregional Enterprise
 - Funded by Contributions from 5 Partner Agencies
 - Operating costs distributed based on flow into the Plant
 - Debt Service payments are calculated based on Subregional Agreement
 - Santa Rosa's share is paid by the Wastewater Fund




Rate smoothing applied to keep increases for user agencies at 5%

Fire Related Revenue Losses 2017/18

- Projected Revenue Loss
 - Water \$1.4m (-3%)
 - Sewer \$1.8m (-2.5%)
- Estimated Based On
 - Actual Charges of Destroyed Properties
 - Based on 16/17 + 3% increase
 - 8 month calculation

Note: 2018/19 projected higher (12 month calculation)

Fire Related Expenses

- Labor and Supplies
 - \$1,060,162
 - Significant portion budgeted
 - Continue to be incurred
- Infrastructure Replacement Costs (preliminary estimate)
 - \$12,710,000
- Non Revenue Water Being evaluated
- Water Main Replacement Contaminated Area
 - Up to \$20m
- Sewer Lateral Capping
 - Up to \$400k for proposed area

2018/19 Operating Budget

- Goals
 - Reduce or eliminate deficit budget
 - Manage fire losses
 - Evaluate all vacancies
 - Explore efficiencies/reductions in levels of service



Undesignated Fund Balance

- June 2017
 - Water
 - \$9.7m
 - Sewer
 - \$19.3m
- Considerations
 - Appropriate to CIP to cover Fire Losses
 - Covering Revenue Loss
 - Balance any operations deficit



CIP Funding

- Actual 2017/18
 - Water \$13m
 - Sewer \$12m
 - Subregional \$4.08m
- Previously Planned 2018/19
 - Water \$13m
 - Sewer \$12m
 - Subregional \$5.08m



Planning for Future

- Big Picture Approach
 - Project prioritization of all known projects
 - Based on Asset Management evaluation
 - Approval will remain for year 1
 - Funding will remain the same for 2018/19
 - Long term work with consultant on funding plan
 - CIP funding plan will evolve with this process



CIP Funding Development

- Total CIP cost estimate / project list
 - best available project data
 - cumulative costs for projects
 - years 1, 2-5 and future (roughly 10 years)
 - Planning projects will increase funding needs
 - example: Subregional Master Plan studies will generate significant construction projects
