

APPROVAL OF GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT-BMP REPLACEMENT AND PROTECTION IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY WITHIN THE BURN SCAR AREAS AND RATIFICATION OF EXECUTION BY THE CITY MANAGER UNDER THE EMERGENCY DECLARATION

BACKGROUND

A combination of gravel bags and weighted wattles
(BMP's) were originally placed at over 1400 locations in
the burn scar area immediately following the fires by
City, County, Army Corps of Engineers, volunteers, non government organizations, etc. to provide environmental
protection from the impacts of the potentially debris
laden storm water runoff. Due to the emergency manner
of placement, these materials were installed
inconsistently and have not been maintained.

ANALYSIS

- On January 24, 2018, Purchasing received one responsible bid to a Request for Proposals to provide removal, replacement, and maintenance of approximately 13,000 gravel bags and 3,100 weighted wattles adjacent to storm drain inlets.
- This work was considered an immediate need and was approved through the emergency authority designated to the City Manager so the materials could be removed and replaced as soon as possible prior to the next rains.

RECOMMENDATION

• It is recommended by the Water Department that the Council, by resolution, approve the award of Contract No. RFQ 18-03, BMP Replacement and Protection in the Public Right of Way within the Burn Scar Areas, to the lowest responsible bidder, Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation of Sonoma, and ratify the City Manager's execution of the General Services Agreement, by his authority under the Emergency Declaration, in an amount not to exceed \$650,000.
