

Santa Rosa Fire Station General Plan Amendment

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• General Plan Amendment:

Revise the Public Services and Facilities Element to reflect the Fire Department's updated long-term station location plan, including the locations of Fire Stations #5, #8 and #9, and the removal of two Rincon Valley Fire Protection District facilities from Figure 6-3.




- 2016: Update of the Standards of Coverage and Deployment Plan completed, which identified the relocation of Station #8 and adjusted location for Station #9.
- 2017: Fire Station #5 was destroyed in the October wildfires. A temporary station is established on Parker Hill Road while plans to rebuild are ongoing.
- December 13, 2017: neighborhood meeting.
- April 12, 2018: Planning Commission recommends approval of the General Plan Amendment.




South Santa Rosa Response Times

Proposed Response Times



Environmental Review California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

Exempt from CEQA, §15061(b)(3)

 The project causes no direct or indirect physical change on the environment.

• The action addresses planned future development outlined in the General Plan.

 Development of future stations will require separate CEQA review.





It is recommended by the Planning Commission and Planning and Economic Development Department that the City Council:

 Adopt an amendment to the General Plan, Public Services and Facilities Element, to reflect the Fire Department's updated long-term station location plan, including the location of Fire Stations #5, #8 and #9, and the elimination of two Rincon Valley Fire Protection District stations from Figure 6-3.





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
