 Outside of the water quality advisory area we see non-detects and meet all drinking water






Sampling Data Inside Advisory Area



Path Toward Restoring Water Service

- Every contaminated water service line will be replaced and re-sampled
- City will install temporary activated carbon water filters, as needed, for occupancy
- Water Quality will be routinely monitored



Meeting Interim Water Needs

- Water for irrigating surviving landscapes
- Water for construction / rebuilding

 - Routine contact with 13 surviving homes, in Advisory Area, out of Advisory Area and Coffey Park
 - Briefing those in the rebuild community
 - Briefing media interests, service groups & community
