

PROFESSIONAL LEGAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

POTENTIAL LITIGATION AGAINST PG&E ARISING FROM THE WILDFIRES OF OCTOBER 2017

BACKGROUND

- The City of Santa Rosa suffered extensive property and economic damages as a result of wildfires that swept into the City beginning October 8, 2017.
- Evidence has emerged that points to PG&E equipment and infrastructure as the cause and origin of the fires.
- Hundreds of lawsuits have been filed against PG&E by individuals, businesses, and public entities. The cases have been consolidated in a single proceeding in the Superior Court in San Francisco.

ANALYSIS

- In light of the extensive damages suffered by the City, and the substantial evidence pointing to potential responsibility on the part of PG&E, the City Attorney recommends that the City initiate litigation against PG&E, and that the City engage outside legal counsel to assist in that lawsuit.
- Baron & Budd, P.C. has joined with a consortium of law firms to offer legal representation for public entities and individuals in connection with the Northern California wildfires.
- Baron & Budd, P.C. has extensive experience in representing public entities in similar large scale tort litigation.

ANALYSIS

- Professional Services Agreement:
 - Contingency fee agreement
 - Negotiated rate of 18% of net recovery
 - Law Firm fronts litigation costs, including expert witness fees.
 - Costs recouped only if a successful recovery is obtained.
 - If no recovery is obtained, no costs or fees will be owed.
- The Office of the City Attorney maintains oversight of the litigation and control of all key decisions in the action.
- City Attorney, legal assistant and other inhouse litigation fees and costs will be reimbursed prior to calculation of any contingency fee.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council, by motion, approve a Professional Services Agreement with a consortium of legal firms, led by the law firm of Baron & Budd, P.C., for legal representation on behalf of the City of Santa Rosa in connection with potential litigation against PG&E arising from the wildfires of October 2017.
