1701 Sidewalk/Verge/Tree Condition Survey

1) Describe your project...

First envisioned in 2015, we have been working with City staff to devise a way to co-operatively repair sidewalks. Property owners need to be involved (must opt-in), the City needs to be involved, and contractors when approached in the slow season with a large assignment should create favorable cost scenarios. Education is key. But so is data, so we will work with professions to develop the criteria then photograph and catalog areas for sidewalk repair and replacement, noting verge conditions and recommended remediation, and condition of street trees. The goal is to have professional grade reports with photographs to share with potential contractors and property owners.

2) Describe your support...

We have broad-based support from everybody who has been approached about the possibilities of smooth sidewalks, attractive verges, and healthy street trees. Property owners are excited about saving money and mitigating liability. The City wants to find a fair solution to making the area safer for all pedestrians, and the City budget will save from legal fees and emergency repairs.

Neighborhood volunteers have been involved collecting data.

City staff has been involved regarding questions about easement permits, when work is to be performed. No permit is needed for the survey, however.

3) Who benefits?

Every pedestrian and property owner, as well as the City.




Repairs will be made by qualified contractors, so the work is meant to last along time. No maintenance for the survey, unless updates are needed due to changing conditions.




As soon as approval is received, we will begin this work. We expect to have it completed in 45-60 days.



Or, if they're too close before we can move, we put our hand out (as a visual "stop" cue); and then (politely) tell the dog's person that we're afraid of dogs and please move the dog away or keep it at a distance until we can move away.

Likewise, I pay attention to when most of the folks in the neighborhood are out walking their dogs, and avoid walking during that time if at all possible.

I would also make sure my child had some positive experiences with friendly, gentle dogs to counter the fear.

What I don't do, is expect the City to ban all dogs from public places.
