WHEREAS, Desmoid Tumors are one of these rare diseases. In the United States, these tumors affect approximately 900 new people each year; and

WHEREAS, there are more than a handful of people battling Desmoid Tumors in Sonoma County right now. Battling to find their diagnosis, and to find a treatment that works – among a sea of treatment options that do not work for many; and

WHEREAS, Desmoid Tumors are aggressive, invasive, and potentially life-threatening. Yet due to lack of awareness, research is limited; medical professionals are mis-educated; and patients continue to suffer through pain, mobility dysfunction, organ dysfunction and worse due to the tumor's effects on the body; and

WHEREAS, the Desmoid Tumor Research Foundation (DTRF) provides hope for the future of the Desmoid Tumor community. Through fundraising, research, and awareness promotion – they seek to find answers; and

WHEREAS, every year, in September, the DTRF holds their largest fundraiser of the year – a patient/doctor meeting, Running for Answers 5K, and community-wide fundraising across the United States; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Rosa acknowledges the importance of the search for a cure, and the plight to raise awareness of Desmoid Tumors and all other rare diseases.
