

Tow Vendor Franchisee List and Franchise Fee

City Council Meeting August 30, 2016 Lieutenant John E. Snetsinger Santa Rosa Police Department

BACKGROUND

- City Ordinance No. 3674 authorizes Council to grant franchises for police-generated tows.
- Current franchise fees were set in 2005
 - \$50,000 Franchise Fee was to be split among franchised vendors.
 - The Fee was based on 2005 tow policies.
 - 70% fewer vehicles towed between 2010 2015.
 - Policies have changed the Department tows/ impounds less vehicles.

PROPOSED

- The Police Department proposes the authorization of agreements with the tow vendors on the tow vendor franchisee list.
- The Department proposes the franchise fee be revised to a per vendor fee of \$300 per year effective September 1, 2016.

RATIONALE

- Because of the current high franchise fee, only 7 vendors currently participate in the tow program.
 - Results in longer wait times for officers and the public.
- Because the Department tows 70% less vehicles, police costs have reduced significantly.

BENEFIT

- The fee change will encourage more tow vendors to participate in the program, thereby benefiting the public.
 - More tow vendors means less waiting for officers and members of the public.
 - Roads are cleared faster.
- The revised per vendor fees will be more in line with the actual cost of managing the tow program.

RECOMMENDATION

- Approval of the tow vendor franchisee list.
- Approval of the revision of the franchise fee to \$300 per vendor per year.
