#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Transportation and Public Works and the Finance Departments, that the Council, by resolution, approve Purchase Order No. 158246 for the purchase of one (1) 2020 International cab and chassis with mounted power sewer rodder (vehicle) with Peterson Trucks, Inc., Santa Rosa, California in the amount of \$396,760.79.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Transportation and Public Works Department is requesting the purchase of one (1) vehicle to replace City vehicle #16201, a 1992 GMC TopKick Truck with a mounted power sewer rodder currently used by the Water Department to clean out roots and blockages to City sewer lines.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Under the City's guidelines for replacement of fleet vehicles, the Transportation and Public Works Department Fleet Maintenance Division selects a vehicle for replacement when it has reached the end of its cost-effective life cycle. This vehicle has met the replacement criteria using a point system, which is an industry standard, to predict when best to sell a vehicle. Repair costs, age, and mileage are considered in the point calculation performed by the City's Faster Fleet software system. This vehicle has exceeded its replacement life cycle and is no longer supported by the manufacturer.

#### <u>ANALYSIS</u>

On November 29, 2018, Invitation for Bids (IFB) 18-127 was opened by the Purchasing Agent. Of the five hundred and twenty-two (522) vendors notified, twenty (20) identified themselves as prospective bidders. Three (3) vendor responses were received, and all were considered responsive and responsible to the bid requirements. As a result of IFB 18-127 competitive process, Peterson Trucks, Inc., Santa Rosa, California was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bid. See table below:
