# 2019/2020 Public Services and Action Plan

- Why CAB?
  - Public involvement important more is needed
  - Outreach to residents, service providers, other stakeholders and constituents
  - Provide input on Plan and public services

### 2019/2020 Public Services and Action Plan

- City is Entitlement Jurisdiction for federal funds: *CDBG, HOPWA, HOME*
- <u>CDBG</u>: must benefit low- or moderateincome/must meet National Objective
- <u>HOME</u>: creation of affordable housing for low-income households
- <u>HOPWA</u>: housing low-income people living with HIV/AIDS & their families

# 2019/2020 Public Services and Action Plan

- <u>CDBG</u>: Up to 15% of grant for public services allowed
- Annual process to solicit public services applications started January 30
- Wide Range of allowable uses per CDBG regulations, however:

#### 2019/2020 Public Services

- Must meet National Objective & benefit low- and moderate-income residents
- <u>Council direction for use</u>: funding for operation of facilities serving persons experiencing homelessness and which participate in and accept referrals from Sonoma County's Coordinated Entry System

#### 2019/2020 Public Services

- Public meeting February 6 at 5:30, Person Senior Wing – Finley Community Center
- Review process and requirements, distribute applications
- Applications also available on City website at <u>www.srcity.org</u>

## 2019/2020 Public Services

- Applications due March 6 for:
  - <u>Public Services</u>: funded by CDBG
  - <u>HOPWA</u>: funded by HOPWA Grant
  - <u>Fair Housing Services</u>: locally funded
- Email completed applications to <u>nmanchester@srcity.org</u>
- Award recommendations by subcommittee, includes a Councilmember

#### Federal Funding Amounts

- Similar amounts as 18/19:
  - <u>CDBG</u>: \$1,426,436
    - If CDBG allocation doesn't change, 15% = \$198,000 +/-
  - <u>HOME</u>: \$729,539
  - <u>HOPWA</u>: \$433,139
- Fair Housing federally mandated but locally funded: \$36,000 in 18/19 from Real Property Transfer Tax (RPTT)

### Federal Reporting

- Reports must be filed on time to receive *CDBG, HOME, HOPWA*
- <u>Consolidated Plan</u>: usually every 5 years; includes multi-year goals & assessment of housing & community needs
- <u>Annual Action Plan</u>: Defines how funds will be spent for the upcoming fiscal year
- <u>CAPER</u>: accomplishments & progress toward Con Plan goals

- Available for public review March 15
- Available online, at CHA, CMO, Main Library
- Announcements in traditional & social media

#### Action Plan 2019/2020

- Comments received are included in final Plan
- Council public hearing on Plan and action on public service contract recommendations May 7
- Action Plan is due to HUD by May 15, 2019
