Year 1 Services December 31, 2018

Resilient City Permit Center

- Dedicated Staffing 6000 peak monthly staff hours (30 positions)
- Expedited Plan Review 5 days for minor changes
- 24 hour inspection turn around with no cap
- Landscaping design consultations and plan review
- Fire plan review assistance
- Water Department assistance service reactivations
- Storm water inspections average of 1500 monthly inspections
- Right of way safety inspections



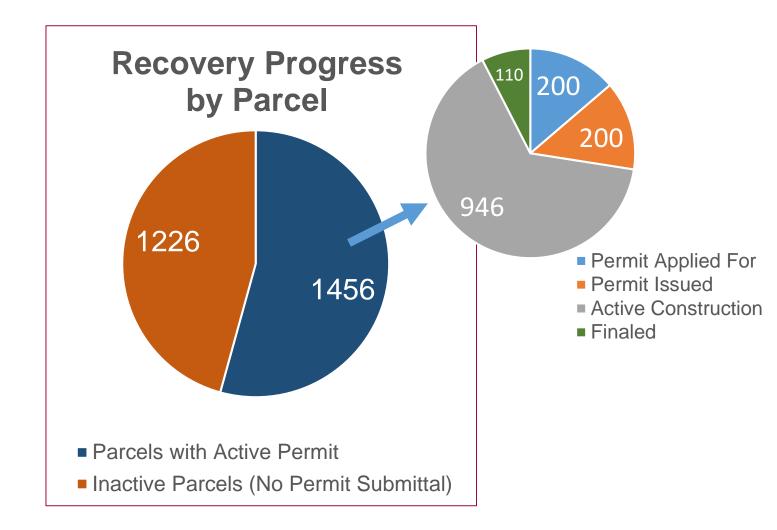


Rebuild

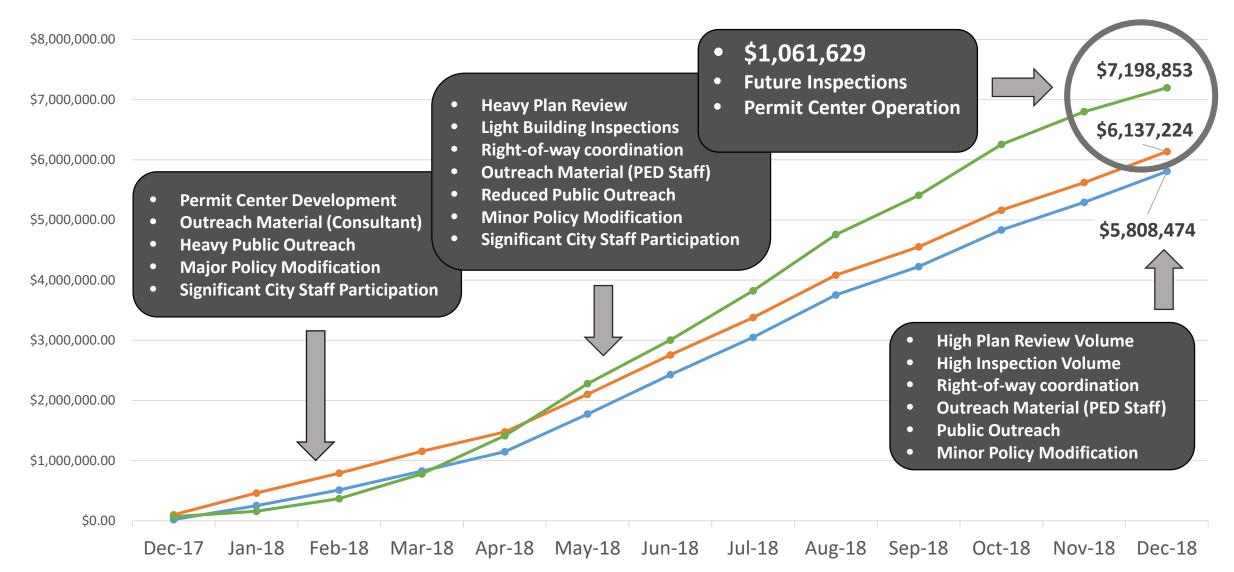

Rebuild

Amend existing Professional Service Agreement with Bureau Veritas

1. Increase not to exceed amount of the agreement to a total of \$9,263,212

- \$377,052 increase to the current not to exceed amount.
- \$3,368,572 increase to the amount budgeted towards the contract
- Total amount will continue to be offset by an average permit fee of \$5,000 per parcel

2. Modify staffing classifications

- Additional salary ranges for Inspector, Plans Examiner and Permit Technician positions
- Separate classification for Office Assistant and Field Technician



Rebuild

Reimbursement for the development of outreach and educational materials

1. Reimburse Economic Development \$188,750 from additional revenue

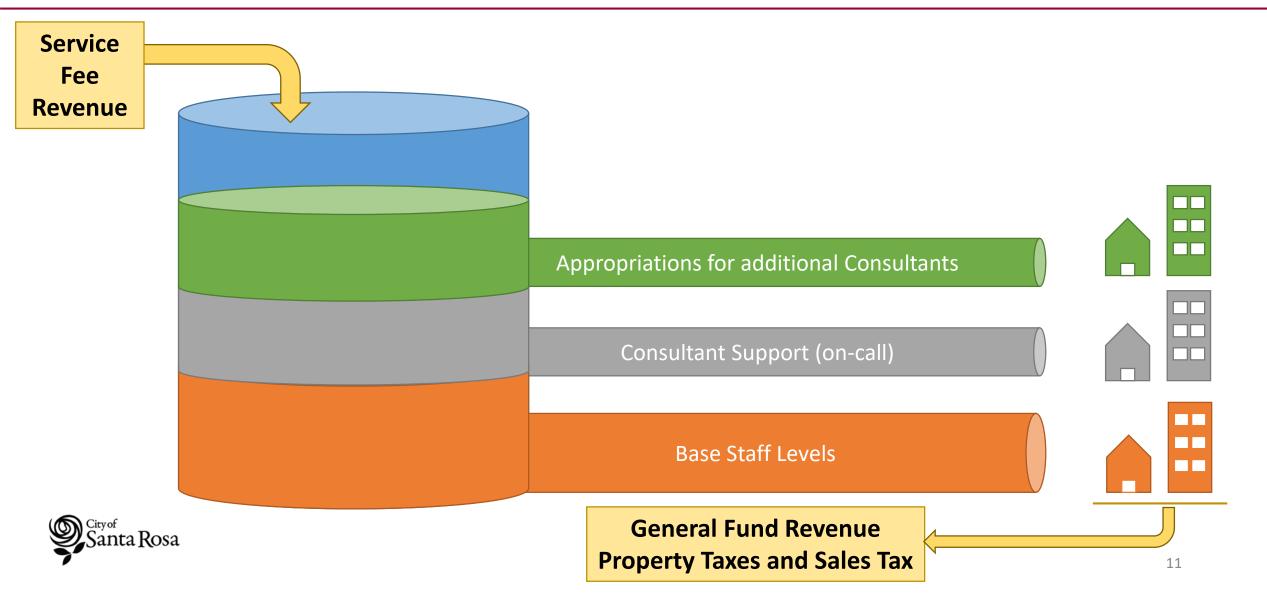
- Professional Service Agreement executed with Engine is Red on October 24, 2017
- Creation of educational materials for development activities throughout the City
- Due to high demand, total expenditures (\$188,750) were dedicated to rebuild resources
- Reimbursement will provide Economic Development the flexibility to focus additional resources on investment and development activities in the Priority Development Areas

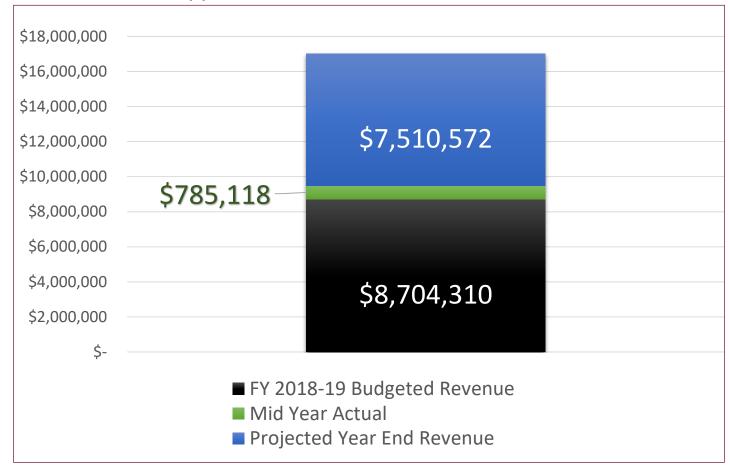

Fees are calculated to support the estimated staff time involved in the review, processing and inspection of specific development proposals





PED Development Services

Planning, Building and Engineering Review and Inspection

Increase appropriations in PED by \$800,000 to provide workload relief through the acquisition of additional professional services

- \$300,000 to be assigned to Building consultant services for plan review and inspection
- \$200,000 to be assigned to Planning consultant services for entitlement review
- \$300,000 to be assigned to Engineering consultant services for plan review and inspection
