

Waterways Advisory Committee Composition Proposal

Revise the Waterways Advisory Committee to 7members comprising of :

- Planning Commission (1)
- Design Review Board (1)
- Board of Community Services (1)
- At-large citizen members (4)






- 1995: Waterways Advisory Committee (WAC) established
- 2000: Second Council member added
- 2005: Two at-large citizen representatives added
- 2007: Third at-large citizen representative added and formalized procedures and terms of the WAC
- 2010: One at-large citizen representative added
- 2012: Redevelopment Agency member eliminated.



Waterways Advisory Committee Composition WAC Role

- Review development projects adjacent to creeks / waterways for consistency with City goals, policies and regulations
- Provide advisory comments
- All projects adjacent to creeks / waterways must be reviewed by the WAC prior to action on the proposal





- Currently comprised of 9 members
- Subject to the Brown Act and quorum requirements
- Lack of a quorum has resulted in meetings been continued, impacting project timelines
- Council members have full schedules, making participation challenging
- Revising the composition of the WAC from 9 members to 7 would reduce the quorum requirement, minimizing scheduling conflicts



Waterways Advisory Committee Composition Recommendation

It is recommended by the Planning and Economic Development Department that the City Council, by resolution, revise the composition of the Waterways Advisory Committee to a seven-member committee comprising of one member each from the Planning Commission, Design Review Board and Board of Community Services, and four at-large citizen members.
