

## Preparedness

### **Food and Water**



### **Drinking water**

1 gallon of water per person, per day



#### Tools and utensils

Non-electric can opener and forks, spoons and knives



#### Food

Nonperishable and easy to prepare without power





### Baby/pet food

Be sure to include food for all members of your household







### **Flashlights**

Do not use candles





#### Radio

Battery-powered or a hand-crank weather radio





#### Extra batteries

Include two extra sets





### Mobile phone

Include a portable charger

## Preparedness

## **Health and Personal Supplies**



#### Basic first aid kit

From antibiotic ointments and bandages to cold packs and more



### Blankets and clothing

Blankets, warm clothes, sturdy shoes and heavy gloves



### Activities for children

Toys, books, games and cards





### Important documents

Copies of IDs, medical records, pet vaccinations and family photos

## Health and Personal Supplies





**Medication and eyeglasses**Prescription and non-prescription





#### **Toiletries**

Soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, etc.





### Cash and credit cards

If possible, put aside at least \$100





#### Other useful items

Paper towels, trash bags, multipurpose tool that includes a knife
