THIRD AMENDMENT TO GRANT AGREEMENT FOR HOMELESS OUTREACH SERVICES TEAM PROGRAM WITH CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF THE DIOCESE OF SANTA ROSA

This Third Amendment to Gra	nt Agreement for	Homeless Outreach	Services Team	Program,

between the City of Santa Rosa, a mu	nicipal corporation	("CITY"), and Cathol	lic Charities of th	ne Diocese
of Santa Rosa, a California non-profit	corporation ("CON	TRACTOR").		

RECITALS

- A. CITY and CONTRACTOR entered into the Agreement for CONTRACTOR to administer a Homeless Outreach Services Team (HOST) "Program." The Agreement provided compensation for the period July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 (Year One) in the amount of \$466,450. HOST is a street outreach team that works to engage persons experiencing homelessness and living in unsheltered locations into services, shelter and housing as part of the "Housing First" model.
- B. CITY and CONTRACTOR entered into a First Amendment to the Agreement for the purpose of modifying the scope of services and total funding under the Agreement from \$466,450 to \$1,000,450 for the purpose of providing additional resources for a Housing First Fund (landlord incentives, risk mitigation, and tenant assistance) for Year One.
- C. CITY and CONTRACTOR entered in a Second Amendment to the Agreement for the purpose of providing compensation for the period July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2019 (Year Two) in the amount of \$557,350.
- D. CITY and CONTRACTOR now desire to amend the Agreement for the purpose of modifying the scope of services and increasing the total funding under the Agreement from \$557,350 to \$1,035,450 for the purpose of providing additional resources for the continued administration of a Housing First Fund (landlord incentives, risk mitigation, tenant assistance, housing assistance) for Year Two to include access to risk mitigation funding for the Santa Rosa Housing Authority's Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program.

AMENDMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. Section 1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Exhibits A, A-1, and A-2 to the Agreement are replaced by Exhibit A-3 to this Amendment.

2. Section 3. GRANT

Section 3(A) is amended to provide Program funding for Year Two as follows:

"A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, Program funding from CITY to CONTRACTOR shall not exceed \$1,035,450 for the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 (Year Two). The City's Chief Financial Officer is authorized to pay all proper claims under this Agreement from Fund 1209 and Key 340707."

Exhibits B, B-1, and B-2 (Budget) to the Agreement is replaced by Exhibit B-3 to this Amendment.

3. Section 15. PROGRAM MONITORING AND EVALUATION.

Exhibits C, C-1, and C-2 (Quarterly Status Report) to the Agreement are replaced by Exhibit C-3 to this Amendment.

All other terms of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

EXHIBIT A-3: SCOPE OF SERVICES

HOMELESS OUTREACH SERVICES TEAM PROGRAM

(Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Santa Rosa)

Planned Outcome

The Santa Rosa Homeless Outreach Services Team (HOST) program (PROGRAM) is a street outreach team that works to engage persons experiencing homelessness and living in unsheltered locations into services, shelter and housing as part of the "Housing First" model. The PROGRAM's service area will be within the CITY limits with primary service areas to be determined based on community need and/or emergent issues. HOST is the designated outreach provider for the City's Homeless Encampment Assistance Pilot (HEAP) Program and other pilot initiatives developed in response to homelessness. The HEAP Program is a multi-disciplinary team focused on a compassionate approach to address the health, safety and shelter needs of persons living in encampments and to ease impacts to surrounding communities.

The PROGRAM will provide a number of services including but not limited to the following:

- Operation of a 24/7 information and referral response line, Clean Start mobile bathroom-shower trailer (Trailer), and Conservation Crew, which provides financial incentives to recently or currently homeless individuals to help with clean-up of abandoned encampments
- Assessment of unsheltered persons utilizing the VI-SPDAT (Vulnerability Index, Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool) and enrollment into Coordinated Entry to access shelter and housing consistent with policies and procedures adopted by the Sonoma County Continuum of Care (Home Sonoma County), including entry of data in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- Assist unsheltered persons to access community resources (health, behavioral health, and alcohol and/or substance use services, benefits enrollment), safe shelter or temporary housing (i.e. safe parking, hotels/motels, campgrounds, emergency shelters, reunification to supportive living situation) and permanent housing

PROGRAM services will be provided by CONTRACTOR in partnership with Social Advocates for Youth and other services providers, which serve Santa Rosa residents, subject to approval by CITY.

Trailer: CONTRACTOR will operate the Trailer weekly providing up to 90 showers at the City Hall parking lot and at other locations approved by the CITY. CONTRACTOR will coordinate operation of the Trailer so as not to conflict with CITY business, events, or programs. CONTRACTOR may also operate the Trailer on properties owned by the County of Sonoma and by private parties, which serve Santa Rosa residents, subject to approval by the CITY, and the respective property owner. Each location is to be restored to its original condition after use of the Trailer by CONTRACTOR. All trash and debris is to be disposed of offsite. All Trailer waste must be disposed of offsite at a designated waste disposal facility. The Trailer will be staffed at all times by CONTRACTOR'S employees and will be stored at CONTRACTOR'S property after every use.

HEAP Program: CONTRACTOR will coordinate the outreach and engagement, assessment and triage, and transition planning and housing placement components of HEAP Program and documentation of these efforts, including but not limited to the following information:

- Number of individuals engaged
- Number of individuals completed VI-SPDAT
- Number of individuals placed into safe shelter/temporary housing and permanent housing
- Number of individuals who accessed storage
- Case notes describing efforts made to assist unsheltered individuals into shelter and housing including refusal of services and documentation relating to any requests for reasonable accommodation

CONTRACTOR will provide this information on a weekly basis during the encampment resolution process along with a final cumulative report following closure of the encampment. CONTRACTOR will also participate in other aspects of the encampment resolution process, including but not limited to resource analysis, creation of action plan, communications strategy, planning meetings, and on-going updates to the City's matrix of encampments via the HEAP Collector App.

Housing First Fund: As part of PROGRAM, CONTRACTOR also administers a Housing First Fund to encourage landlords to rent to persons experiencing homelessness as well as to assist these individuals to locate and maintain housing. This is achieved through the provision of the following:

- Landlord Incentives Leasing bonuses and support hotline
- Risk Mitigation "Insurance Pool" or funding available to landlords in the event of non-payment of rent or excessive damage to a rental unit, including access for the Santa Rosa Housing Authority's Section 8 Housing Choice Voucer (HCV) Program.
- Tenant Assistance Transportation and housing preparation costs, and housing navigation, location, and stabilization support services
- Housing Assistance Security deposits and rental payments, including Rapid Re-Housing, utility deposits and payments, moving costs.
- Marketing and outreach activities to promote PROGRAM to landlords

Planned Outputs

- o 400 unsheltered homeless persons engaged by HOST, of these:
 - 200 Coordinated Entry enrollments or referrals, utilizing VI-SPDAT
- o 400 calls made to 24/7 response line
- o 50 coordinated abandoned camp clean-ups with Conservation Crew participants
- o 2,000 showers will be provided through the operation of the Trailer
- o Administration of risk mitigation funding for the HCV Program

Planned Indicators

- 100% of HOST participants will engage into supportive services, including those engaged through Trailer
- 50% of HOST participants enrolled in Coordinated Entry will be provided safe shelter or temporary housing (safe parking, hotels, campgrounds, emergency shelters, reunification to supportive living situations)
- 40% of HOST participants enrolled in Coordinated Entry will be provided permanent housing, of the housed cohort that CONTRACTOR can track through agency specific HMIS:
 - o 85% will retain their housing (measured at 6 months and 12 months)
