

2050 General Plan Kaiser Permanente Community Health Needs Assessments Grant

Background

- Kaiser Permanente's assessments help identify and measure community public health needs and assets.
- The General Plan Update will address impacted economic and environmental conditions in its disadvantaged communities.
- The Grant provides additional funding the City will use to expand its public engagement and promotion of Health City policy in the 2050 General Plan as a means to help identify and correct social and environmental inequity that lead to poor public health outcomes.

Analysis

- The expanded community engagement will help to ensure the 2050 General Plan will directly benefit lower income residents, who are primarily persons of Hispanic descent and other non-white persons, which comprise 28% and 12% of the City's population, respectively (2010 Census).
- Lower income residents are concentrated in the Roseland, Downtown, West End, and Monroe neighborhoods where public participation in community planning activities is low.

Recommendation

It is recommended by the Planning and Economic Development Department that the Council, by resolution, approve:

- The acceptance of the \$600,000 Grant.
- Upon receipt of the Grant, amend the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 budget to increase appropriations in General Plan Update JL key 08015.
