12.1 City Hall Campus Sidewalk Reconstruction Phase 1. The cost estimate is \$337,426 and they are possibly going to award the contract on this date.

This proposal seems inappropriately timed to me because of ongoing discussion with the County about converting the City Hall complex to a dual City/County Government complex, in which the whole area would be torn up. The proposed reconstruction areas are along D Street and along Santa Rosa Avenue.

I'm emailing the Council on this and I hope you will, too.

- 12.4 Ordinance Adoption second reading Termination of the Temporary Prohibition on Rental Housing Price Gouging and Tenant Evictions Without Cause. On December 10, the Council vote on this was 5-1-0, with Vice Mayor Fleming voting No. It is said that now that State law is in place (although it mandates a more lax prohibition on what is considered price gouging), the local program is no longer needed. HMMMM Report
- 14.1 Measure O Cycle X Choice Grant. Measure O is a sales tax voted in first in 2004 and later amended. It promises 20% of funds received to go to the Gang Prevention /Intervention Programs. Funds are shared between the Recreation Department's Neighborhood Services Division and the Violence Prevention Partnership (formerly the Mayor's Task Force). The dollar amount for the period from 1/1/20 to 12/31/021 is \$840,000.
- 14.2 Council Position on the Proposed half-cent sales tax Ballot measure to be called "Sonoma County Wildfire Prevention, Emergency Alert and Response Transactions and Use Tax" that is proposed by a City/County group.
- 14.3 Installation of a Public Restroom in the Downtown Area. Money has been approved for this purpose by the council, but actual construction of the unit won't start until a site is selected for installation. An analysis of sites was done by staff and a downtown interest group. Three sites are suggested: City Hall on Santa Rosa Avenue, City Hall Annex at 90 Santa Rosa Avenue and at Prince Gateway Park.
