SUBJECT

Fiscal Year 2021/2022 Transportation and Public Works Work Plan Preview

ISSUE

The Board may consider the draft Fiscal Year 2021/2022 Transportation and Public Works (TPW) Work Plan for bicycle and pedestrian projects and studies.

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

Each year Transportation and Public Works (TPW) staff presents a proposed work plan for the Board to review. Annual Work Plans are created based on the bicycle and pedestrian projects that are in project development and the capacity of staff to work on the projects. Staff will bring the Work Plan back to the Board at your next meeting for your consideration.

Staff presented the draft FY 2020/2021 Work Plan to the Board on September 19, 2019. The Board provided comments which were incorporated into the Work Plan. The Board, by motion accepted the FY 2020/2021 Work Plan at their meeting on November 21, 2019.

ANALYSIS

1. Transportation and Public Works uses a work plan to program pedestrian and bicycle projects and studies into the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for the upcoming budget year (Fiscal Year 2021/2022).
2. Staff has updated the draft Work Plan to include the First Phase Project List (projects and studies) from the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update 2018. (See Attachments 1/1A.)
3. Not all pedestrian and bicycle projects will necessarily be completed through the Transportation and Public Works Work Plan as some projects will be implemented as new development occurs.
4. The Work Plan includes some bicycle and pedestrian projects that are not included in the First Phase Project List. These projects are usually grant funded, such as segments of the Kawana Springs Road, Hopper Avenue, West Third Street Class II bicycle lanes and Dutton Avenue sidewalk, Bellevue Avenue pathway, Franklin Avenue pathway and Franklin Park Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) and sidewalk. In these cases, staff was able to identify projects which best fit the grant program criteria and could successfully compete for the funding. For your reference, attached are the Bicycle and Pedestrian priorities from the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan.
