BACKGROUND

May 2004

• All incorporated cities <u>except</u> Healdsburg and Sonoma passed resolutions consenting to inclusion in assessment district

November 2004

• Sonoma County Tourism Business Improvement Area assessment established

2004 - 2020

- Series of 5 administrative agreement for assessment collection and disbursement entered into between City and County
- Last disbursement agreement terms ended June 30, 2019

KEY POINTS

Agreement:

- Modified term to remain in effect until or unless the City or County notifies of intent to terminate
 - Notice of termination: no less than 60 days before the end of the fiscal year
 - Agreement remains in effect regardless until completion of that fiscal year
- No late fees on funds collected since termination of previous agreement

Amount Due to County:

- Estimated net amount due to the County: \$1,181,772
 - Assessment funds collected between July 2019 through June 2020: \$1,205,890
 - Estimated 2% administrative fee: \$24,118



RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Planning and Economic Development Department that the Council, by resolution:

- approve the Administrative Agreement for Collection of Assessments for Sonoma County Tourism Business Improvement Area, retroactive to July 1, 2019;
- authorize the remittance of any assessment funds collected from Santa Rosa lodging establishments but not remitted between July 2019 and September 2020; and
- authorize the City Manager to execute the Administrative Agreement.
