
- Melita/Los Alamos Rd
- Oakmont
- Skyhawk and Piedmont Heights
- 30 homes destroyed
- 13 homes damaged





- The Resilient City (RC) combining district, was adopted to facilitate and expedite the rebuild process after the 2017 wildfires
- Existing RC Language:
 - Expedite rebuild area permit processing
 - Allow the construction and occupancy of an ADU prior to the primary residence
 - Allow the reconstruction of certain legal nonconforming structures
 - Permit continuance of certain non-conforming uses
 - Allow extended construction hours, among others





Skyhawk Area



- Construction Hours- Reinstitute Noise Ordinance
- Removal of Mobile Home Park Language
- Exempt All Electric Requirements for Consistency
- Expiration Date: Dec 31, 2023
- Other Amendments for Clarification



Adoption of this Ordinance is Exempt

- CEQA Section 21080(b)(3) regarding repairs and replacement work after a state-declared disaster
- Section 21080(b)(4) regarding actions to mitigate or prevent an emergency
- 15269(a) regarding maintaining, repairing, restoring, demolishing, or replacing property or facilities damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster
- 15269(c) regarding specific actions necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency.



Recommendation

Adopt an Urgency Ordinance to recognize the Glass Fire:

- making text amendments to Zoning Code Section 20-28.100, Resilient City Combining District, and
- rezoning impacted properties in order to facilitate streamlined rebuilding and community resiliency.



- The proposed urgency ordinance would be effective immediately upon enactment.
- Under the City Charter, 4/5 vote required to adopt an urgency ordinance.
