

City of Santa Rosa's Creek Stewardship Program Storm Drain Labeling Project Art on the Street for Clean Creeks



Public art, job training for youth, and environmental stewardship blend with colorful storm drain labeling to draw attention to the connection between streets and creeks. Artstart, the Creek Stewardship Program and Envirichment, three long-standing, successful programs in Sonoma County, CA, are providing aspiring young artists opportunities to create environmentally themed art. Hand-painted fish labels placed around inlets to the storm drain system inspire residents to help prevent pollution from entering the drains that flow into the nearest creek. This project is the first of its kind created for the 175,000 citizens, 18,000 storm drains and 100-mile network of creeks in Santa Rosa, CA.

Environmental Need: Storm drains carry rainwater from Santa Rosa's streets and parking lots to the closest creek. Often, water flowing down storm drains contributes pollution to that creek. Trash in creeks is a major pollution problem that threatens healthy wildlife habitat and water quality. Inspiring people to care for creeks through caring about what flows into storm drains is a proven method to decrease water pollution and improve creek health.

Project Installation: We are looking to find the best storm drains to install this art on. Storm drains that have a high amount of visibility and foot traffic are the most suitable for this project. Please contact us if there is a storm drain you would like to see this art installed on.

Pilot Project Proposal

Creation of a mural on the west abutment of the Gamay Street bridge over Steele Creek near Jennings Avenue will serve as a pilot project to guide program partners and participants through the process of creating a Creek Bridge Mural. After incorporating the lessons learned, the process can be followed to brighten other neighborhoods with Creek Bridge Murals. The Santa Rosa Public Art Master Plan supports such projects. All project aspects are designed to comply with COVID-19 health orders while providing our community a safe way to engage.

Budget

The bridge abutment selected for the mural on the west side of Gamay Street is approximately 58 square feet, a mid-range sized mural. Artstart would incorporate a community outreach component to create and install the mural for \$4,500.

"7.1 Stream Corridor Crossing Markers

Santa Rosa's riparian corridors cross under arterial roads and neighborhood streets at regular intervals. Most of the bridges at these crossings are owned by the City, and though the crossings are generally marked by road signs, they could be also highlighted by simple public art projects that bring additional visibility, such as mosaic panels inset into the parapets of the bridges, or special street markings. The Public Art Program could collaborate with the Utilities and Transportation and Public Works Departments to determine an easily applicable suite of improvements that could be created by artists working with nearby communities and install projects as funding allows on bridges that the City owns."


