Potential Uses of Settlement Funds

Fire Resiliency Unmet Needs (\$42M - \$47M)

- Public Assistance Local Match (\$1.1M)
- Fire Station 5 Rebuild (\$14.5M)
- Damaged Sidewalk Repair (\$4.1M)
- Damaged Pavement Repair (\$24M)
- FEMA Ineligible Costs and Disallowances (\$1M \$5M)
- Vegetation Management One-time Costs
- Hazardous Tree Removal
 - Public Right of Way
 - Open Space
 - Private Property



Potential Uses of Settlement Funds, cont.

Operational Needs

- GF Reserves Restoration and Stabilize Structural Deficit (\$10M - \$40M)
- PERS UAL Payment for Pension Cost Relief Still Evaluating

Community Needs

- Renewal Enterprise District Seed Money (\$10M)
 - Jump Start Affordable Housing in Downtown
- Roseland Library (\$1M \$10M)

Virtual Commuity Input Meeting #1

September 24 - Fire survivors of Coffey Park neighborhood area & fire-impacted mobile home communities

Attendees: 23

"We can't burn down again. We need to do whatever we can to not let that happen."

"We all gave and we just want Coffey Park to be made whole. We just need the City to finish that last mile."

"Need to create a reimbursement process for those who didn't want to wait 3 years & took money out of their rebuilding insurance to repair sidewalks that were damaged."



Virtual Commuity Input Meeting #2

October 21 - Fire survivors of the Fountaingrove, Hidden Valley, Montecito, and Oakmont neighborhood areas

Attendees: 14

"Until every last thing is addressed and fixed from the fires, the funds shouldn't be used for anything else."

"Actions should be taken sooner rahter than later to use the funds to make repairs -- we've waited 3 years already."

"The areas impacted by the fires 3 years ago don't feel like Santa Rosa. Those areas need to be restored back to the lush green Santa Rosa neighborhoods like before".



Virtual Community Input Meeting #3

October 22 - Citywide Attendees: 42

"Complete land acquisition for the SW Greenway."

"We need more resources in SW Santa Rosa. We still don't have a library. It's been 15 years since community members began asking for one."

"The City must invest in fiber optic installation to the premises in the City." "Please prioritize affordable housing as your number one consideration"

"We must invest in vegetation management in our wildland urban interface or all of these others needs like housing, infrastructure, etc, will be for not."







Did you reside within the Santa Rosa city limits during the October 2017 wildfires?






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



Was your Santa Rosa home or business destroyed or fire damaged in the 2017 wildfires, or did a family member perish in the 2017 wildfires?

Was your Santa Rosa home or business destroyed or fire damaged in the 2017 wildfires, or did a family member perish in the 2017 wildfires?






SPANISH SURVEY RESPONSES Do you currently reside within the Santa Rosa city limits? Total Responses: 32 yes no 13%


Do you live within Santa Rosa's high-wildfire risk areas, Wildland Urban Interface?


















Broadband/Internet for All Through the Addition of Fiber Optic or Wireless Solutions Total Responses: 2,971



SPANISH SURVEY RESPONSES Broadband/Internet for All Through the Addition of Fiber Optic or Wireless Solutions Total Responses: 32



English Survey Responses

- 1. 89% Vegetation management/fuel reduction in Santa Rosa's high-wildfire risk areas
- 2. 79% Strengthening the resiliency of the City's infrastructure
- 3. 69% Evacuation route construction and improvements in the WUI
- 4. 61% Wildfire readiness and emergency preparedness community education
- 5. 53% Home-hardening incentive/assistance programs
- 6. 51% Support for business/workforce recovery through business loans/grant programs
- 7. 50% New community assets such as a libraries, community centers, pools, etc.
- 8. 50% Homeless services
- 9. 48% Park improvements, such as new parks, all-weather sports fields, other amenities
- 10.45% Broadband/internet for all via fiber optic or wireless solutions
- 11.44% Road repairs not associated with fire recovery
- 12.38% Jump start affordable housing opportunities through incentive funding

Spanish Survey Responses

- 1. 96% Vegetation management/fuel reduction in Santa Rosa's high-wildfire risk areas
- 2. 94% Wildfire readiness & emergency preparedness community education
- 3. 91% Evacuation route construction and improvements in the WUI areas
- 4. 87% Home-hardening incentive/assistance programs
- 5. 84% Strengthening the resiliency of the City's infrastructure
- 6. 72% Road repairs not associated with fire recovery
- 7. 53% Jump start affordable housing opportunities through incentive funding
- 8. 47% Support for biz/workforce recovery through business loans & grant programs
- 9. 47% New community assets such as a libraries, community centers, pools, etc.
- 10. 45% Homeless services
- 11. 41% Broadband/ internet for all via fiber optic or wireless solutions
- 12. 28% Park improvements, such as new parks, all-weather sports fields, other amenities
