B. Project Narrative:

Project Description

Community Housing Sonoma County (CHSC) owns Hearn House, a 15-bed transitional housing facility for homeless veterans seeking drug and alcohol treatment. Hearn House is located at 2149 West Hearn Avenue in Southwest Santa Rosa. It was developed and placed in service in 2012.

Nation's Finest provides property management, direct services, and services coordination, which it pays for through its own grants, and has been operating Hearn House successfully for 8 years. Veteran program participants pay no fees. The program includes a variety of direct supportive services based on individual needs. Nation's Finest is well known throughout the community as the first-line provider of services to veterans, whether homeless or not, and has an excellent reputation for conducting programs in a caring and holistic manner.

In 2012, when Hearn House was developed, the Sonoma County 10-Year Homeless Action Plan identified veteran transitional housing as a high priority, specifically calling for 116 transitional housing units for homeless veterans with disabilities, such as mental or physical disability or substance abuse.

Today, the need for Hearn House continues. The City has identified housing and programs for persons with special needs, including persons experiencing homelessness, as priorities in its 2035 General Plan Housing Element, and in 2016, the Santa Rosa City Council proclaimed a local homeless emergency. The situation was exacerbated by the 2017 wildfires and the City Council has approved extensions to the proclamation on a regular basis ever since. The latest proclamation extension was approved November 10, 2020.

We are requesting these funds from the City of Santa Rosa to finance needed emergency bathroom repairs. The main bathroom at Hearn House developed a leak under the shower floor that has led to damaged flooring under the showers and surrounding area. The subfloor has rotted compromising the integrity of the flooring and making the showers unsafe to use. The funds requested with this application will allow the bathroom to be repaired, enabling the continued safe operation of the Hearn

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House program. All residents have been relocated by Nation's Finest until the bathroom is repaired.

o Project Constraints and/or Issues

No constraints. Nation's Finest, the program operator, has moved the residents to other housing, so Hearn House is unoccupied and will remain unoccupied for the repairs. One potential issue: dry rot more extensive than anticipated – the budget includes a hard cost contingency to assist with costs, if this issue arises.

 Summary of Experience and Qualifications of the Applicant and Development Team

Community Housing Sonoma County ("CHSC") has been developing permanent supportive housing in Sonoma County for 26 years, including rehab and new construction. At CHSC, they believe HOME is for everyone. CHSC puts that belief to work by creating housing opportunities for veterans, people living with disabilities, and individuals experiencing homelessness. CHSC is a local leader in the development of supportive housing communities where people find not only a home, but also access to services to assist them in living meaningful, healthier lives in a supportive environment.

Since 1994, CHSC has helped create affordable housing for over 365 people, supportive housing for 203 people, leveraging over \$85 million in financing from local, state, and federal sources. CHSC works collaboratively to identify and respond to the changing needs of the community. Each project they develop is unique, creating different types of rental housing environments, serving a variety of people with special needs, using a wide array of financing tools. CHSC's work impacts individual lives, families, and our community infrastructure, health, and safety.
