February 18 - The first virtual public meeting was held for the Master Plan possess for Dutch Flohr Neighborhood Park. We had good attendance with 45 citizens attending.

February 23 - Council approved two Professional Services Agreements for the Parks division: David L Gates & Associates for the Finley Aquatics Spray Ground project and Callander & Associates for Parks Deferred Maintenance Assessment

March 1 – Spring/Summer sports field permits for baseball, soccer, bocce and lacrosse were issued. Over 3,500 youth and adults are using our fields under current Health Order and weather permitting.
