Housing Authority Mission

To ensure adequate, decent, safe and sanitary housing for qualified people within Santa Rosa consistent with Federal, State and local law.



FY 20/21 Accomplishments Rental Housing Assistance

- Continued rental assistance to over 2,000 families during COVID-19 pandemic without interruption.
- Immediately increased assistance payments to families who lost income during pandemic, and modified operations to ensure participant and staff safety
- Solicited proposals for project-based vouchers in conjunction with Trust's Notice of Funding Availability for CDBG-DR funds
- Initiated HOME-funded Tenant Based Rental Assistance program, providing emergency funds to Santa Rosa residents impacted by COVID-19.



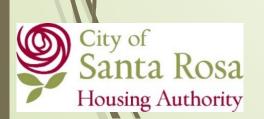
FY 21/22 Key Initiatives/ Challenges Rental Housing Assistance

- Utilize CARES Act resources and initiatives to continue response to COVID-19 health crisis; continue to provide essential services while ensuring participant and staff safety.
- Pursue additional Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) funding including special and disaster-related voucher funding
- Utilize HCV resources to support affordable housing development and preservation.



FY 20/21 Accomplishments Housing Trust

- Facilitated two funding cycles that awarded over \$42.2M to affordable housing projects, including the City's \$38.5M in CDBG-DR housing funding.
- Performed compliance for over 4,000 units.
- Administered additional Federal CARES Act funding to address impacts of COVID-19.



FY 21/22 Key Initiatives/ Challenges Housing Trust

- Manage loan \$122M loan portfolio and compliance monitoring for 4,000+ units.
- Solicit, evaluate, originate and close loans for affordable housing development, conversion and rehabilitation
- Pursue additional funding opportunities to further create and preserve affordable housing in Santa Rosa.



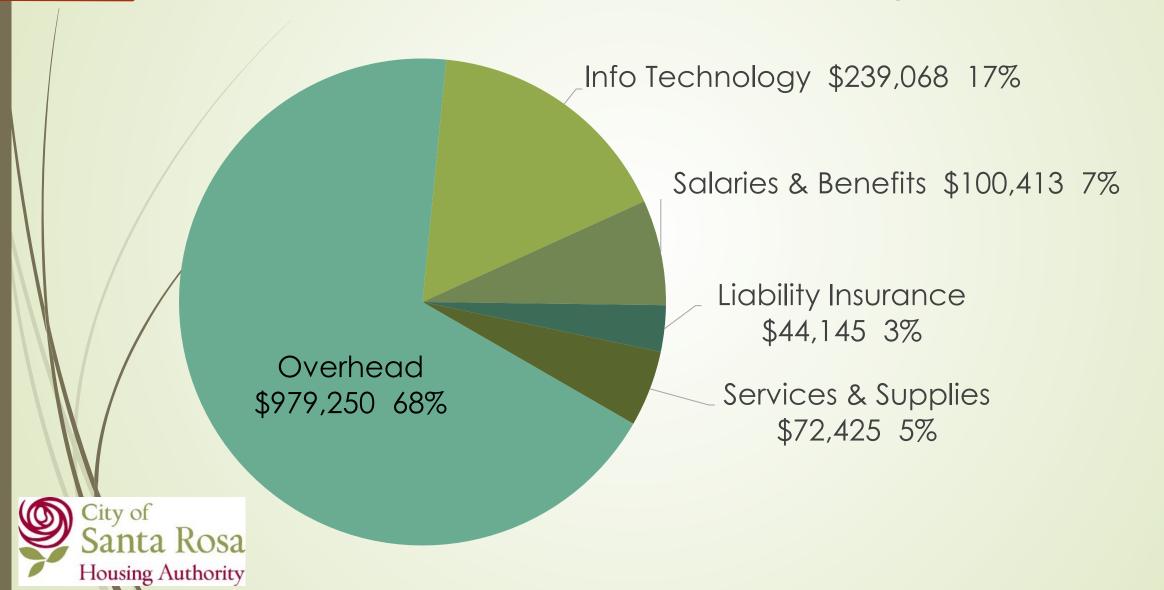

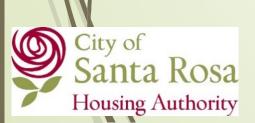

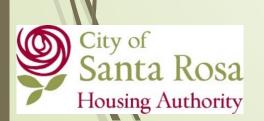

FY 20/21 Housing Trust Budget

- Increase in new revenue due to higher loan repayments in FY 20/21
- Real Property Transfer Tax increase to affordable housing
- Uncommitted carryover reduced due to lower impact fee revenue
- HOME used for Tenant Based Rental Assistance, not loan activity
- Budgeted Reserve: \$371,720- meets target
