Item # 4.2: Gas Station Regulation discussion

We urge the Climate Action Subcommittee to vote for Option 1: Prohibit new gas stations within City limits.

Permitting new gas stations in 2021 will only prolong dependence on fossil fuel-powered vehicles into the future, when we should instead be reducing dependency on fossil fuels by providing more affordable, safe, clean, connected public transportation; safe, accessible, connected facilities for pedestrians and cyclists; and increased affordable and accessible EV charging infrastructure.
