


Established in 1894, the SRFD currently protects:

 - 39 personnel on-duty daily

- 148 FTE
- 26,409 calls for service (CY 2020)
 - LNU Lightning and Glass Fire are single incidents
- 3,238 Inspections;
 13,618 Weed
 Abatement Inspections;
 2,114 Plans Reviewed
- >30,000 hours of training



- Between 1964-2017 the largest wildland fire within the City limits was 42 acres.






Operational Enhancements
