
# Russian River Water Supply

- Santa Rosa receives about 94% of our water supply from Sonoma Water
- Sonoma Water operates two reservoirs, Lake Mendocino (1959) and Lake Sonoma (1984)
- Sonoma Water transmits supplies from Lake Sonoma to cities and contractors in the region, including Santa Rosa, via subsurface collector wells and aqueduct system
- Lake Sonoma holds an estimated four-year water supply for contractors
- Both reservoirs are currently at their lowest levels for this time of year in their history of operation






### Regional Drought Response Timeline 2021




**Lake Mendocino Storage** 






#### **Lake Sonoma Storage**



### Sonoma Water Allocations

- Section 3.5 of the Restructured Agreement for Water Supply outlines how water will be allocated during a water supply shortage and also provides that the Water Advisory Committee (WAC) can, by unanimous vote, determine an alternate allocation methodology
- May 3, 2021, the WAC unanimously adopted a temporary allocation of water deliveries for this summer (July-October)
- June 14, 2021, State Water Board Order requiring Sonoma Water reduce diversions from Russian River by 20% compared to 2020
- Sonoma Water issued allocations to all contractors
- Monthly allocation for Santa Rosa is up to 20% less compared to 2020


#### **Cumulative Sonoma Water Russian River Diversions**



### Drought Response

June 29, 2021 - Santa Rosa City Council:

- Declared a drought emergency
- Adopted Stage 3 of the City's Water Shortage Contingency Plan
- Directed staff to implement the water conservation program as defined by Stage 3 to realize a mandatory community-wide water use reduction of 20%
- Authorized the utilization of Water Enterprise Catastrophic Reserve funds, if necessary



## Stage 3 Prohibitions

#### **Water Waste Ordinance**

- always in effect
- Prohibits leaks/breaks in water system
- Prohibits Overspray and runoff


#### Stage 3 –Prohibitions

- Irrigation limited to 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM
- Shut-off nozzles for hoses required
- No washing hard surfaces (unless required for public health)
- Restaurants only serve water upon request
- Hotels and Lodging linens upon request messaging
- No pressure washing with potable water



# Implementation and Enforcement of Prohibitions

- Immediate Outreach to customers
- Water Waste Patrols
- Water Waste Reporting Form
- Automatic Metering Infrastructure
- Variances for certain health, safety, construction activities

- Efficient Clothes Washer (\$50-100)
- Free WaterSmart Devices

   Showerheads, aerators,
   toilet flappers
- Recirculating Hot Water Pumps (\$100)

#### **Outdoor Rebates**

- Irrigation Efficiency Upgrades (up to \$100)
- Cash for Grass (\$1.50/SF)
- Rainwater Harvesting (\$0.25 per gallon storage)
- Greywater Reuse (\$75 per fixture/\$200 per 1000 gal)

 Will be supported by existing program funds




## Drought Changes to Green Exchange Program



# Drought Drop-by: August 21st


Region-wide event: 13 locations in Marin, Mendocino and Sonoma Counties

- Reuse bucket and more
















