


## Nayeli Rivera

<p>A storefront retailer has a physical location where cannabis goods are sold. Storefront retailers can also deliver cannabis goods.</p>	<p>Stands for indoor cultivation using exclusively artificial lighting between 5,001 and 10,000 square feet, inclusive, of total canopy size on one premises</p>	<p>Type 11 distributors can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Move cannabis and cannabis products between cultivation, manufacturing or distribution premises</li><li>• Move finished cannabis goods to retail premises</li><li>• Provide storage services to other licensees</li><li>• Arrange for testing of cannabis goods</li></ul>	<p>Type 7 manufacturers can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use volatile solvents for extraction or post processing (refinement) of cannabis extract</li><li>• Use non-volatile solvents for extraction or post processing</li><li>• Use mechanical methods for extraction</li><li>• Make cannabis products through infusion</li><li>• Package and label cannabis products</li></ul>
