GENERAL PLAN UPDATE

What is a General Plan?


California state law requires each city to adopt a general plan "for the physical development of the city". They address a range of important community issues, nine of them are mandatory in our State: **land use, circulation, noise, safety, housing, open space, conservation, air quality, and environmental justice**.




The General Plan Update process, known as **Santa Rosa Forward**, provides an important opportunity to **revisit** and **rethink** community planning policies and programs.




PROCESS OVERVIEW





Alternatives Process

The General Plan Update includes the development of **three distinct alternatives** to help frame approaches to future community growth, preservation, and circulation. The alternatives process is important because it provides an opportunity for the community to discuss and refine major policy choices that will be used to develop a Preferred Alternative (which will be the basis for the new draft General Plan).



Community Survey #1: The Heart of Your Neighborhood

Open Feb to March 2021, this survey included questions about community health, ways people would like to be engaged, and an exercise to "Map Your Neighborhood."

Over **1,300** Santa Rosans completed the survey!



Technical Advisory Committee



The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) is comprised of technical experts from City departments and partner agencies that provide feedback on the project and ensure plan concepts can be achieved.




The TAC has met regularly to confirm data and information and provide insights into the Visioning process.


Community Advisory Committee


The CAC is a key part of the community engagement strategy.


They are a community-based Advisory Committee that are acting as liaisons to help the City reach out to the full Santa Rosa community.





Community Vision Workshops (District-wide)

City Council / Planning Comission Study Session
