<b>Title:</b>	PUBLIC HEARING - RESOLUTION TO ADOPT PROPOSED WATER DEMAND FEE SCHEDULE AND ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE CITY CODE TO ADOPT THE PROPOSED WASTEWATER DEMAND FEE SCHEDULE BASED ON THE 2021 WATER AND WASTEWATER DEMAND FEE STUDY FINAL REPORT				
	<p>BACKGROUND: Water and wastewater demand fees, one-time fees charged for new development, are updated periodically to adjust the fees based on current system valuation and customer usage. On August 26, 2014, the 2014 Water and Wastewater Demand Fee Study and the current demand fee schedule were adopted by City Council.</p> <p>The proposed 2021 demand fee update will increase the demand fee per one thousand gallons of water and wastewater. However, residential categories, based on Santa Rosa Water customer usage, have reduced resulting in the combined 2021 water and wastewater demand fees being less than the current combined demand fees.</p> <p>RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by the Board of Public Utilities and Santa Rosa Water, that the Council: 1) by resolution, approve the amended water demand fee schedule; and 2) introduce an ordinance amending Chapter 15-16 of the Santa Rosa City Code to incorporate the approved sewer demand fee schedule, re-adopting the annual adjustments, and make related changes.</p>
