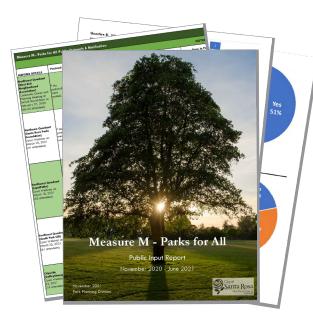

Measure M - Overview

Countywide sales tax over 10 years: 4/1/2019 to 3/31/2029

Revenue breakdown:

- Two-thirds to Sonoma County Regional Parks
- One third to the Nine (9) Cities in the County
- Santa Rosa has averaged \$1.8m annually

Measure M - Capital Improvement

- Projects prioritized for nearest to construction
- FY 25/26 new budget allocation: \$1,487,118
- Measure M funds leveraged to close funding gaps
- Approximately \$4.7M utilized for projects nearest to construction

- Portions of Cook and Jacobs Parks funds may be utilized for projects closer to construction
- Total previously dedicated to current projects \$7.5M

- Budget: \$10,901,408
- <u>Expenditures : \$4,871,487</u> July 1, 2025 = \$6,029,921

Year 7 (FY 25/26)

- Remainder + Budget: \$7,517,037
- <u>Expenditures : \$5,067,054</u> July 1, 2026 = \$2,449,983
- Year 8 10 (FY 26/27 29/30)
- Remainder + Budgets : \$6,928,983
- <u>Expenditures : \$6,928,983</u> July 1, 2030 = \$0

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Maintenance Budget/Expenditures

Years 4 - 6 (FY 22/23 - 24/25)

- Budget: \$2,825,096
- Expenditures: \$775,965
 July 1, 2025 = \$2,049,131

Year 7 (FY 25/26)

- Remainder + Budget: \$3,122,792
- <u>Expenditures: \$2,371,070</u> July 1, 2026 = \$751,722

Year 8 - 10 (FY 26/27 - 29/30)

- Remainder + Budgets: \$4,333,722
- <u>Expenditures : \$4,333,722</u> July 1, 2030 = \$0

Recreation Budget/Expenditures

- Budget: \$706,274
- <u>Expenditures: \$251,987</u>
 July 1, 2025 = \$454,287

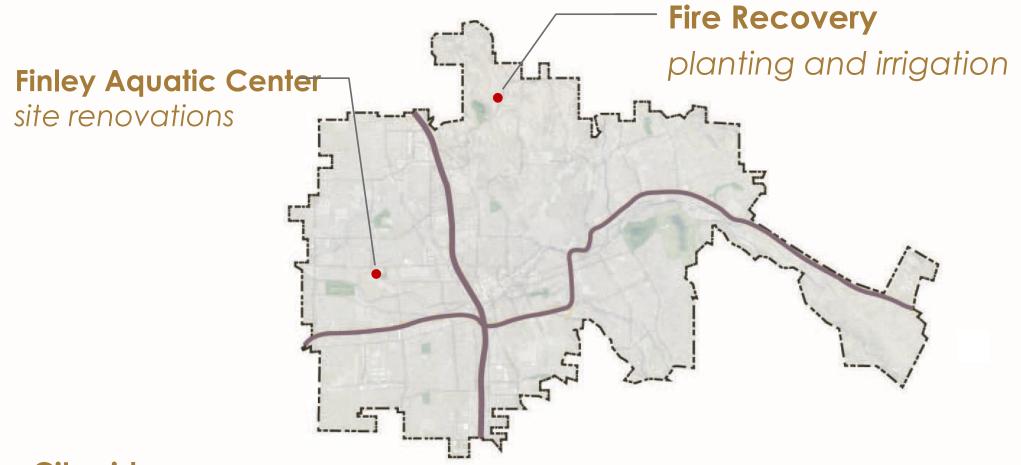
Year 7 (FY 25/26)

- <u>Expenditures : \$979,703</u> July 1, 2030 = \$0



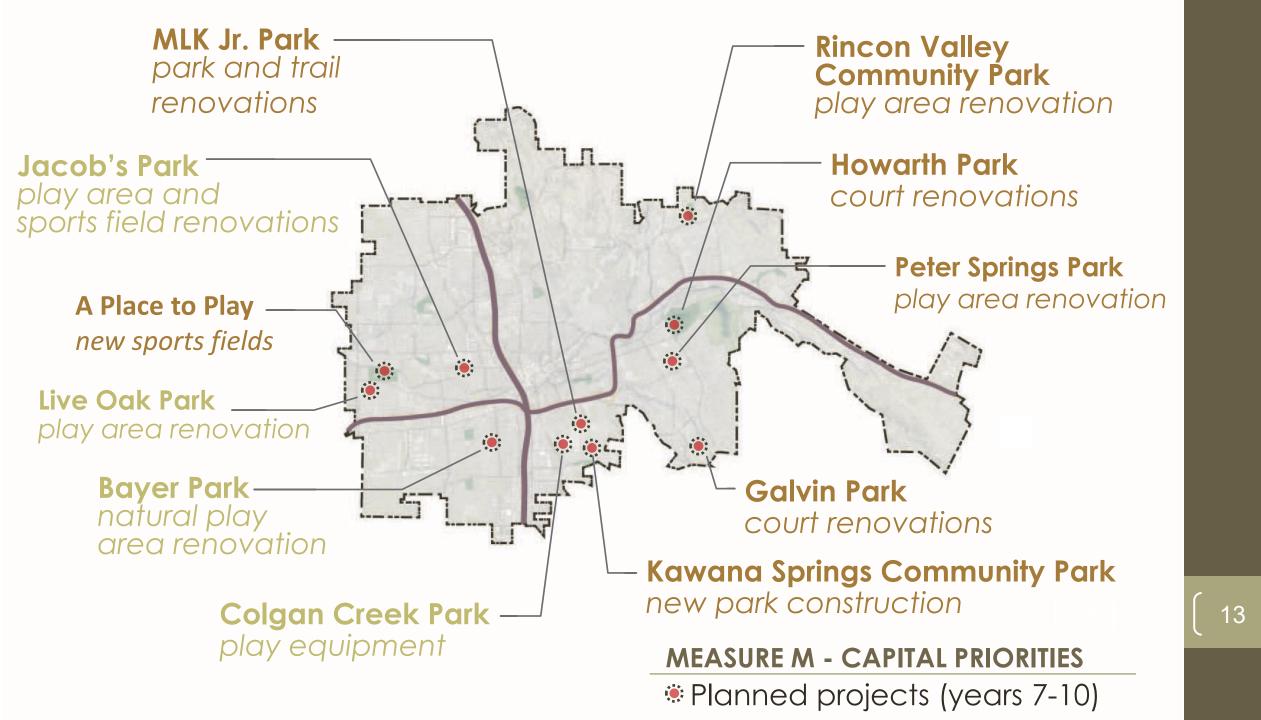


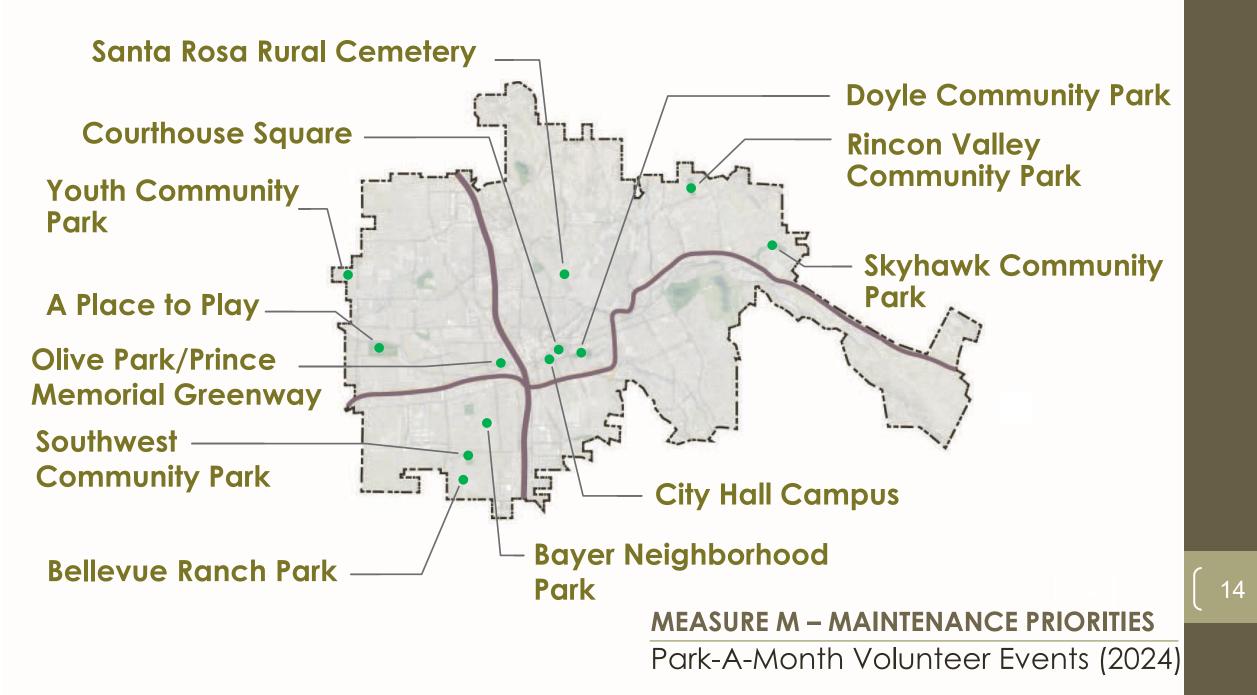

Current to end of FY 24/25 (years 1-6)

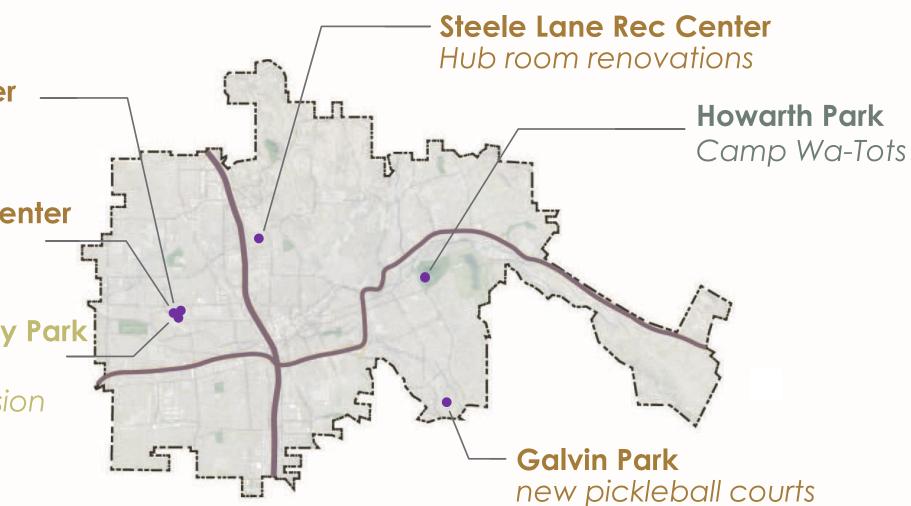






Finley Aquatic Center pool heater replacement
