BACKGROUND

Santa Rosa Tourism Business Improvement Area (SRTBIA)

Established: May 25, 2010, by City Council Ordinance No. 3946

Formed under the Parking and Business Improvement Area
 Law of 1989 (Streets & Highways Code §36500 et seq.)

Purpose:

- Fund programs, services, and activities that promote tourism in Santa Rosa
- Support lodging operators by increasing overnight stays through marketing and promotion of the city's scenic, cultural, and recreational assets

STRUCTURE

Assessment Structure:

- 3% fee on overnight stays at Santa Rosa lodging establishments
- Funds dedicated to marketing and tourism-related activities that drive overnight visits

Fund Administration:

- Lodging operators remit assessments quarterly to the City
- City retains a 2% administrative fee
- Remaining **98%** distributed:
 - 30% → City of Santa Rosa Economic Development Division
 - 70% → Santa Rosa Metro Chamber (contracted for tourism and welcome center operations)

GOVERNANCE

SRTBIA Advisory Board:

- Established by City Council
 - Recommends use of funds and assessment methodology
 - Prepares Annual Report each fiscal year (per §36533) detailing expenditures and benefits


Ongoing Oversight:

 City Council annually adopts the SRTBIA Board's Annual Reports, Budgets, and Work Plans

Staff Support:

 Staffing and SRTBIA Board liaising through the City of Santa Rosa Economic Development Division

- Expands fund uses to include additional tourism-related activities
- Aligns with Ordinance No. 3946 and the Parking & Business Improvement Area Law of 1989

ANNUAL REPORT

The Santa Rosa Tourism Business Improvement Area Advisory Board met on September 25, 2025, to approve the Annual Report, Budget and Future Work Plan.

WORKPLAN

- Three-year plan (amendable annually)
- Shifts administrative and clerical duties not assigned to the Board to staff
- Calls for development of a Santa Rosa Tourism Strategic Plan
- Increases collaboration with regional tourism partners
- Directs an evaluation of SRTBIA operations, including processes, board composition, and meeting frequency
- Calls for greater support of art, culture, and economic development initiatives

IMPACTS

Fiscal Impact:

No impact to the City's General Fund

Environmental Impact (CEQA):

- Not considered a "project" under CEQA §15378
- Alternatively exempt under CEQA §15061(b)(3) no potential for significant environmental effects

RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Economic Development Department recommends that the Council, by resolution, approve the 2024 Santa Rosa Tourism Business Improvement Area (SRTBIA) Annual Report, Budget and future Work Plan and the continuation of the annual assessment on Santa Rosa lodging businesses as further defined in § 6-56.300 et seq, in City of Santa Rosa code.
