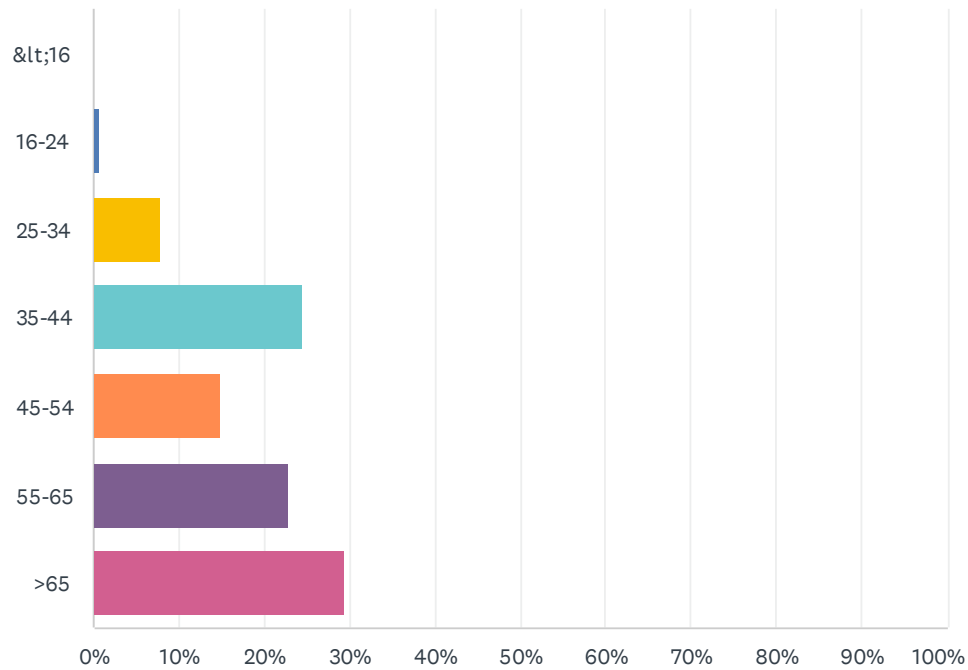

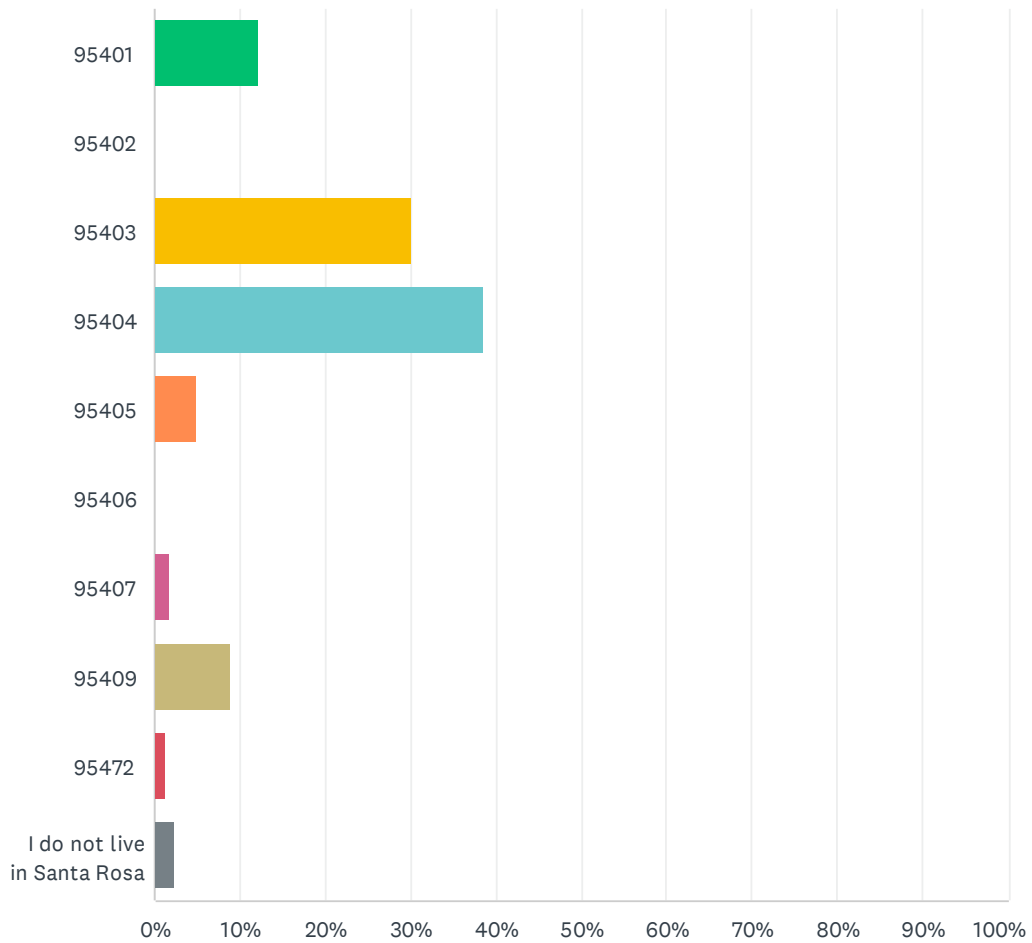

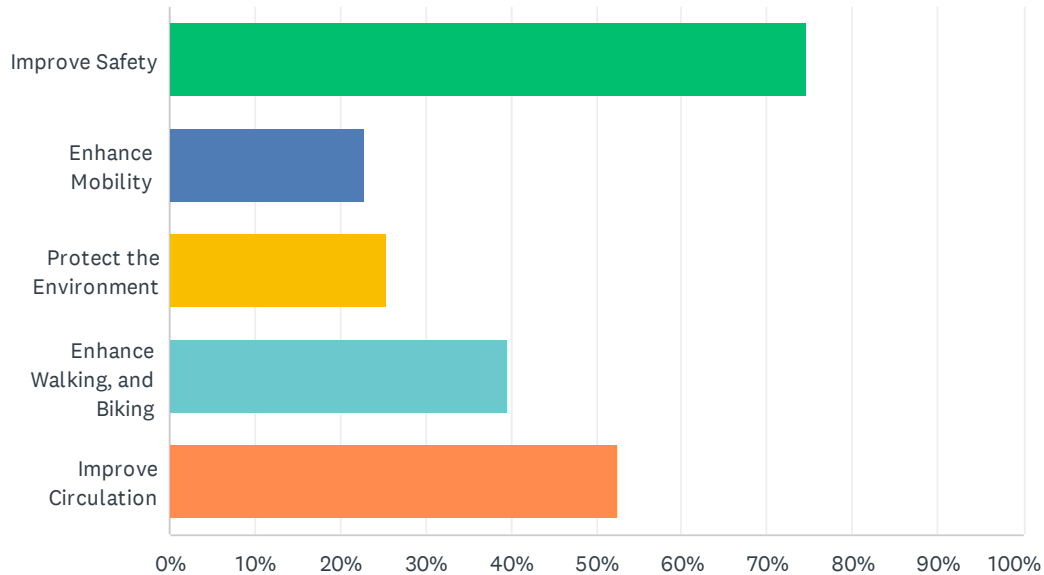

Q3 What transportation priorities are most important to you? (choose up to 3)

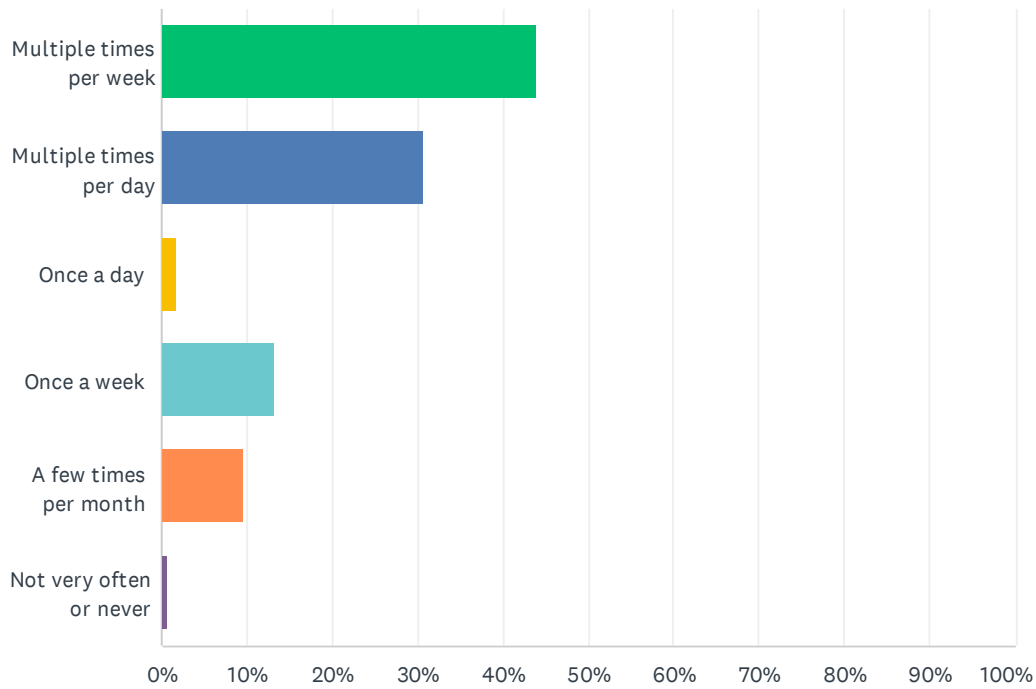

Q4 How often do you travel through the Pilot Study area on Steele Lane?

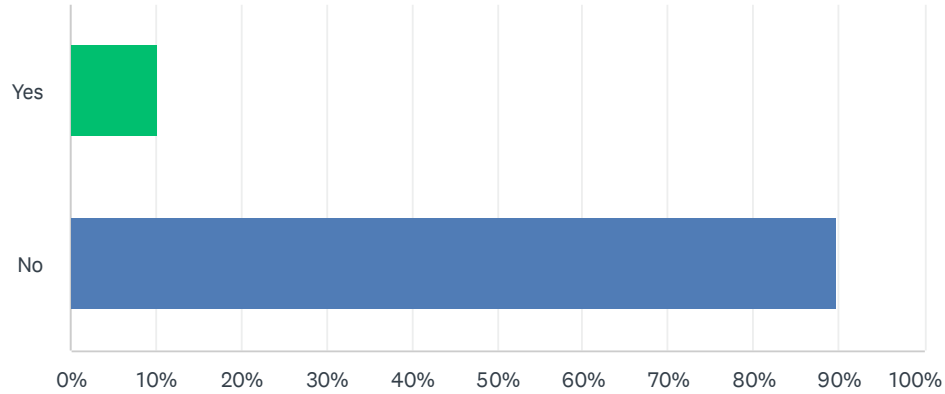

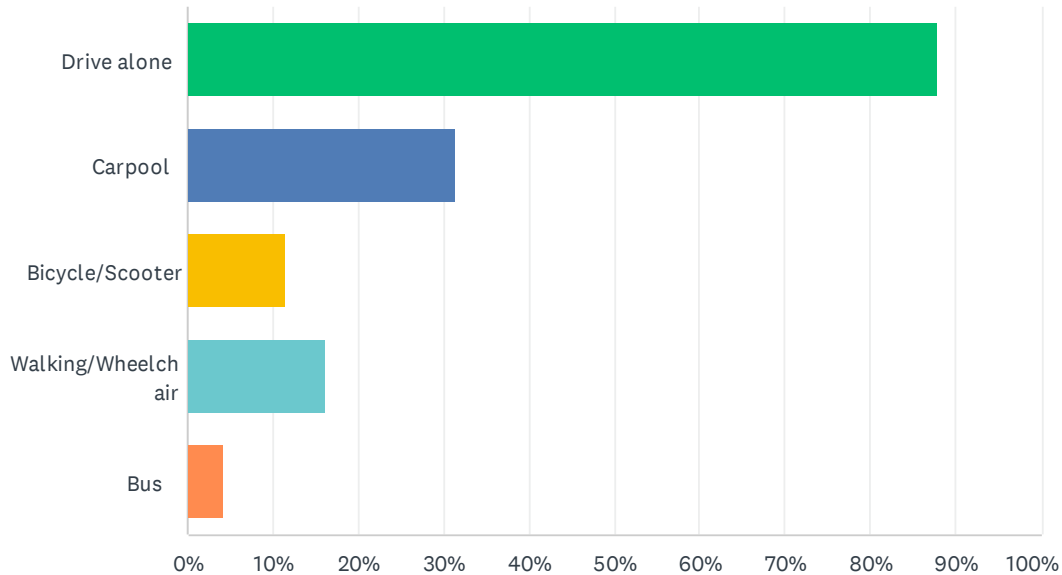

Q6 What modes of transportation do you use when traveling through the Pilot Study area on Steele Lane? (choose up to 5)

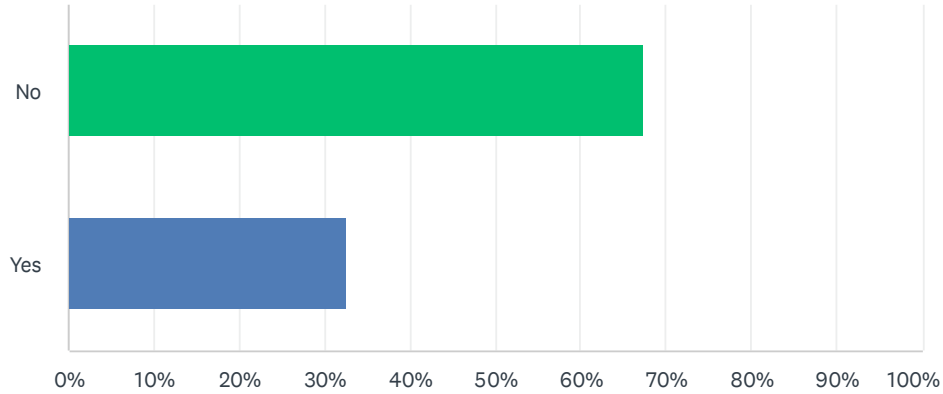

I would like to suggest that the city take a hard look at the current zone - it is not as was originally described, stopping short of the western border. And more importantly a restriction to left hand turns needs to be considered. That is the majority of the traffic congestion even before the "diet"	Yes. I grew up on Rowe Drive (2285) and have resided at 2236 as an adult for the last 22 years. I am aware of the many traffic matters including people coming out of the CVS shopping center and landing in the front yard of the houses that face Steele Lane at Rowe Drive, as well as many others. If there were no left turns allowed from Steele Lane west of Rowe in either direction (so allowable into the shopping center) partnered with no left turns off of Steele Lane between Meyers and Rowe, it would reduce everything from congestion to the "race around" behaviors going east to west/west to east on Steele that result in sideswipes and rear end accidents that happen with some regularity. I don't love the single lane west but can adapt as long as I am not also forced to sit and wait for someone that is sitting in the lane wanting to turn left into Berkeley Drive, as an example.
