For the record:

1. The original notices were no way in 10 pt. print. They must have diminished the size of the print to fit the information. Maybe 7 pt. Maybe 8. The notices were barely legible (why not have requisitioned a sample of one?). Plus, most residents got them the Tuesday or Wednesday before Thanksgiving for the initial hearing to be held the following Tuesday. Some residents did not receive them at all.

This was mentioned several times during the hearings before the Planning Commission. Our information was dismissed.

We greatly appreciated Councilman Alvarez's concern that Spanish-speaking residents were not informed. The fact is, no one was.

2. The City was corrected at the Planning Commission meeting that Vintage Park is not a senior <u>care</u> facility. These are individual apartments and its residents are independent.

It seemed as if we had two adversaries, Verizon with its teams of experts, intent on providing you the picture most likely to gain them their win, and the Planning Commission. One of their members condescendingly told us that these were "esoteric" issues and hard to understand. We are old. We have much life experience. We are intelligent. And we are wise.
