




# Lake Pillsbury Storage

# Sonoma Water: Forecast Informed Reservoir Operations

- Allows Sonoma Water to coordinate with USACE on increased storage within historical flood control pool
- Lake Sonoma: Currently 19,000 acre-feet of additional storage (maximum)
- Lake Mendocino: Currently 3,400 acre-feet of additional storage
- USACE is in currently coordinating decision for releases

# Sonoma Water: Winter Operations

- December 23: SWRCB Temporary Urgency Change Order in effect through June 21
- For determining minimum instream flows, water year hydrologic index to be based on storage in Lake Mendocino instead of cumulative inflow to Lake Pillsbury
- Current water supply conditions: *NORMAL*

- Santa Rosa usage – 15.7 MG



New filter installation scheduled for 2026 at the WC Pump Station



# 2025 Ag Irrigation Season Summary

- Overall, a good year, with a mild Summer.
- Agricultural irrigation supply ended November 7, 2025
- Allotments were guaranteed through September 30
  - **69%** of bulk agricultural allotment used
    - 1.0BG of 1.4BG
  - Highest use – **90 MG**, but **54%** of allotment
    - Pasture, Vineyard, Vegetable irrigation customer
  - Lowest Use - Some small, hobby farms used **0%**.


## Agricultural Allotments & Usage 2022-2025
