

Dear Council Members,

As an Israeli, a Jew, and a child of Holocaust survivors, my understanding of "an end to occupation" is a euphemism for denying the rights of the returnees to the ancestral land of Zion (Israel) and the rights of the Jewish descendants of those who have never left our ancestral homeland. The saying "an end to occupation and illegal settlements." sounds simple but it is not, and being stuck in this mindset will only perpetuate the continuation of war suffering. In the demonstrations in support of the terror group Hamas, we hear the repeated slogan "From the river to the sea Palestine will be free". Ironically many of the demonstrators are unable to name the river and the sea. Israel is located between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean Sea and many of the demonstrators are unable to point out where it is. In a better understanding this "From the river to the sea ..." slogan is a call for Genocide. Israel very soon will reach a population of ten million and many of the uninformed call to dismantle it. A country that is a regional technological, industrial, economic, and army superpower. All the uniformed calls and slogans just deepen and prolong the conflict.

Three views for "an end to occupation";

- 1. The area includes Israel, Jordan, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip
- 2. The area includes Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip

These two views constitute a call for war, expulsion, ethnic cleansing, and genocide. This concept will continue to send thousands of young people to die in endless wars. Currently, millions of people who disagree with this idea live there.

3. The area includes the West Bank and the Gaza Strip

Israel disengaged from the Gaza Strip in 2005 to commence "an end to occupation and illegal settlements." This step could have been a positive step toward initiating Palestinian statehood that could have expanded into the West Bank. But the Gaza Strip was taken over by Hamas, and its violent overthrow of an incipient new order turned out to be catastrophic. Israel had forcibly removed Israeli citizens and left behind greenhouses worth millions of dollars for the people of Gaza to use and with which to further develop their economy. The greenhouses were looted, turned into metal scraps and firewood, and the area became a launching pad for rockets shot into Israel, targeting Israeli towns and villages. To this day Hamas also uses schools, hospitals, and residential spaces as launching pads for its rockets, and uses its people as human shields. The Gaza Strip, with its archeological history, moderate climate, and stunning beaches could have become a premier tourist spot of the Mediterranean, but it was turned into a center of misery and suffering by its misguided leaders.

Wars

Four major wars have been imposed on Israel since the nation obtained independent statehood in 1948. Although Israel prevailed in all these wars, it has faced demands that were imposed on the sides that were defeated in the wars, a twisted logic that was previously unheard of in world history.

1948 The Israel War of Independence

Although the newly founded independent State of Israel called on the Arab countries and its Arab residents for peace and cooperation, their leaders chose war and attacked the one-day-old state with the intention of slaughtering its people and ending its existence. Israel was attacked by the armies of seven neighboring countries as well as by its local Arab population. Israel prevailed in this war and ended up occupying an area larger than what the UN voted to be allocated for the new state of Israel in the 1947 partition plan.

Here is a quote from the Israel Declaration of Independence (translated from the original Hebrew):

"WE APPEAL to the Arab inhabitants of the State of Israel – in the very midst of the onslaught launched against us now for months – to preserve peace and participate in the upbuilding of the State on the basis of full and equal citizenship and due representation in all its provisional and permanent institutions."

"WE EXTEND our hand to all neighboring states and their peoples with an offer of peace and good neighborliness and appeal to them to establish bonds of cooperation and mutual help with the sovereign Jewish people settled in its own land. The State of Israel is prepared to do its share in a common effort for the advancement of the entire Middle East."

1957 The Sinai War

Israel attempted to stop the Egyptian-based fedayeen terrorist infiltrators from killing its citizens, to end the blockade of its southern sea in the Straits of Tiran, and to open the Suez Canal that had been blocked to all Israeli ships. Israel conquered large parts of Sinai, took over the Gaza Strip, and destroyed fedayeen terrorist bases there. Israel prevailed in this war, stopped the fedayeen, and terrorist infiltrators, and ended the blockade of its southern sea in the Straits of Tiran, but was not successful in opening the Suez Canal to Israeli ships.

1967 The Six-Day War

Egypt positioned its armies along Israel's southern border, blockaded the southern sea in the Straits of Tiran, and threatened to invade and commit genocide. Israel attacked preemptively, on the morning of June 5 within three hours the Israeli air force destroyed entirely the Egyptian air force while their fighter planes were on the ground in the airfields. Later on, that day Syria and Jordan attacked Israel and they suffered similar fates, their air forces were destroyed. Israel fought on three fronts and in six days it conquered the old city of Jerusalem, the West Bank, the Golan Highs, the entire Sinai Peninsula, and the Gaza Strip.

1973 The Yom Kippur War

On October 6, Israel suffered a surprise attack by Egypt and Syria. In the beginning, the Egyptian forces crossed the Suez Canal to the east and took over parts of western Sinai, The Syrians invaded and took over large parts of the Golan Heights. Within eighteen days the Israeli forces pushed back the Egyptian forces from most of the gained territories, crossed the Suez Canal, took over land west of the Suez, and encircled and besieged a quarter of the Egyptian army west of the Suez. The

ceasefire halted the Israeli forces at the southern edge of Ismailia and seventeen miles from Cairo. In the north, the Syrian forces were pushed back from the Golan and Israeli forces took over territory east of the Golan.

War has never brought peace

War is ugly and terrible. War does not plant orchards nor plow fields. War does not build houses. It causes grave suffering and massive displacement of people. Between 1920 and 1970 (and the majority after 1947), 900,000 Arab Jews endured government-sponsored pogroms, were expelled from lands where their ancestors had lived for thousands of years before Islam, and had their homes, properties, and wealth confiscated by the governments of their countries of residence. A majority of these refugees, 600,000 were resettled in Israel and stopped being refugees upon their arrival. The Arab countries, by attacking Israel on May 14, 1948, created the Arab refugee problem. The Arabs that fled the war are deliberately kept as refugees to USE them as fuel to feed the fire of hatred and war. These refugees have been used cynically and cruelly by their official leadership, by the Arab countries where they reside, and by their allies until this day.

Anwar Sadat - Peace Treaty Between Egypt, Jordan and Israel

Golda Meir, the Israeli Prime Minster during Yom Kippur was the best to express the Israeli mindset about the Israeli-Arab conflict, a translation from Hebrew: "We can forgive the Arabs for killing our children, but unable to forgive them for forcing us to kill their children. We will have peace with the Arabs when they will love their children more than they hate us." This was the state of mind that enabled Israel to sign a peace treaty with Egypt after Anwar Sadat made a historic visit to Israel. On 19 November 1977, Anwar Sadat became the first Arab leader to visit Israel officially when he met with Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin and spoke before the Knesset in Jerusalem about his views on how to achieve comprehensive peace and end the Arab–Israeli conflict. Thousands of Israelis lined up along the road from Tel Aviv Airport to Jerusalem greeting the leader that was willing to stop being an adversary and giving him a hero welcome. In 1981 Anwar Sadat was assassinated by his people but his bold move ended the hostilities between Israel and Egypt till this day. Egypt and Israel are an example to the whole world, after many years of young men from both sides murdering each other it is possible to negotiate peace, make it happen, and keep it. The Egypt-Israel Peace Treaty was signed in a ceremony at the White House on March 26, 1979, and the three leaders—Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, U.S. President Jimmy Carter, and Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin—joined hands and shared big smiles. In 1994 King Hussein of Jordan signed a peace treaty with Israel. Since then, Egypt, Jordan, and Israel had disputes and diplomatic disagreements, but have never had armed confrontations. http://www.theatlantic.com/photo/2015/03/on-this-day-36-years-ago-the-signing-of-the-egyptisraelpeace-treaty/388781/


Hello

Please see this historic timeline of the Land of Israel

We cannot be called settlers and colonialists in our ancestral land. Ignorance has never saved a life

After the Bar-Cochba Revolt in 144 AD (1879 years ago), the Romas called the land of Israel "Palestina Suria" naming the land after the Biblical extinct Phlelstim that disappeared 400 years earlier. The Romas aimed to detach the Hebrews from the land of Israel. The ruling empires continue calling the land "Palestina". There has never been an independent "Palestinian State" and the concept of a "Palestinian" nation is a new 20th-century invention. In 6 to 4 BC, the Jewish prophet, Jesus of Nazareth was born and was killed by the Romans in 33 to 36 AD.

Theory, 10,000 years Sematic tribes migrated east as the Sahara started drying because of the end of the Ice Age. Some moved to today's Ethiopia, others to today's Israel and Iraq. Ethiopian languages (Amharic and Tigray), Hebrew, Arabic, and Aramaic are sister languages.

The oldest Hebrew writing 3900 years old, was found in Sarbit El Hadem (an ancient Egyptian temple in Sinai) written on clay tablets. Apparently, the Hebrews worked for the ancient Egyptians as construction workers.

The Hebrew in English is the deformation of the original word Aaivri translated to Nomads.

There were several Hebrew-speaking Nations and tribes, some settled and others nomadic. Hebrews, Edom, Moab, Phenicia, Canaanite one-town kingdoms, and nomads.

The Hebrew nation started forming in 1530 BC after the fall of the Hyksos Empire in Egypt and Hebrew-speaking refugees escaped to Canaan (today's Israel). In 1300 BC Araminan (not Armenian) refugees escaped to Kenan from the Assyrian war (King Shalmaneser I). A stone inscription was found, King Shalmaneser I boasting, "I destroyed 80 towns and blinded 14,400 men". 1334 BC, the sun God Aten funded by Phero Akhenaten was annulled after his death and the followers and priests ran for their lives to Kenaan. The early biblical priests of the One Good,

El had Egyptian names, an indication that the refuge priests joined and influenced the evolving One God religion.

The arriving refugees were able to settle and mix with the Hebrew-speaking tribes. The large number of refugees escaping ancient Egypt can be referenced to the Biblical story of the Exodus.

1100 BC, the first known Hebrew king, Sahul.

1050 BC, King David united the Hebrew tribes and set Jerusalem as the capital of his Israelite kingdom.

1000 BC, King Solomon succeeded his father, David.

950 BC, King Yerovaam succeeded his father, Solomon. King Yerovaam did not do well and the kingdom split into two, Israel in the north with the capital Dan ruled by King Rechavaam, and Judea with its capital Jerusalem.

720 BC, The Kingdom of Israel was destroyed by the Assyrian Empire and most of its people were exiled to North Mesopotamia (Iraq today).

King Hezekiah, 725-696 BC, decadent of King David, his royal seal was found recently in Jerusalem. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hezekiah

In 587 BCE, Nebuchadnezzar II besieged and destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple, bringing an end to the kingdom. A large number of Judeans were exiled to Babylon, and the fallen kingdom was then annexed as a Babylonian province. Seventy Years later the Persians destroyed the Babylonian Empire the let the Kingdom of Judea recover and rebuild Jerusalem. Seventy years later Jerusalem and the Temple were rebuilt with the support and Encouragement of the new conqueror, the Persian empire, Cyrus the Great.

Maccabean revolt against the Greeks, 165-160, liberated Jerusalem and Judea and established a Jewish (Israelite) kingdom that lasted for 71 years until the Roman conquest.

63 BC, Roman rule and end of independent Judea

6 to 4 BC, the Jewish prophet, Jesus of Nazareth was born and was killed by the Romans in 33 to 36 AD.

70 AD, the Romans destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple.

73 AD, the Romans siege on Masada

144 AD, the Bar Chochvah revolts against the Romans, The Israelites who are called Jews too, were murdered, enslaved, and exiled by the victories Romans. The land of Israel was turned into a wasteland and that was the beginning of the Jewish exile.

During the changing Empires that ruled the land of Israel, Roman, Byzantine, Muslim, Seljuk, Uthman, and the last British until 1947; the land was neglected and undeveloped. Through that empire ruling times small populations of Jews, Arabs, Druse, Shomronits, and Cherkesians lived there.

324 AD, the start of the rule of the Byzantine Empire 635 or 638 AD, the Islamic conquest of Jerusalem 1099 AD, the Crusaders conquered Jerusalem 1291 AD, the start of Mamluk Sultanate period 1517 AD, the Start of Ottoman Empire period 1917 AD, state of the British Mandate 1947 AD, independent Israel

Dear Honorable Members of Santa Rosa City Counsel,

I write in Opposition To Resolutions on the Israel-Hamas War. I believe local governments should focus on local issues. Recent events in Northern California and worldwide have proven that Non-Binding Resolutions inflame hate, targeting the Jewish Community; according to studies, there has been a 360% increase in hate crimes against Jews. It is reported that 55% of all religiously motivated hate crimes are against Jews, who represent 2.4% of the population-one of the larger minority groups.

In short, the history in the Middle East is very complex and Non-Binding Resolutions only inflame existing racial tension and create more division. Thank you for considering my remarks, before the Santa Rosa City Goal Setting session today: Your work is incredibly important for the City of Santa Rosa, as I have mentioned about historic aspects. Mr Rosenberg, Hugh Codding, David Berto, Hugh Futrell, Steve Rabinowitz, have made significant influences. Yours can be remarkable or not.

My comments should be taken in the context of the Hearn Avenue Overcrossing Capital Improvements;

It is not that you are being misled, but you are being given only 1/2 the story.

The 2006 Accounting Reforms required full Profit & Loss Corporate Statements; including Depreciation which is the bookkeeping offset for unfunded Maintenance, primarily roadways (sewer & water). [Diminishing a Nonprofit's Assets is a violation of their corporate governance (this occurred while I was Accountant for the SC Task Force for the Homeless, which I told them, but the Board ignored). Excess maintenance is an upgrade and increases Asset lifetimes, while underfunded maintenance is a "booked" loss to assets as Depreciation and usually decreases Asset lifetimes. Engineers fund maintenance, Finance people defer maintenance, which brought forth these Reforms.] The Roadways are deteriorating, meaning the Assets are losing value, which should be reflected in a Loss (by Depreciation) to your Accounting.

Poorly invested Capital projects increase your Maintenance.

To answer the primary question presented by the Finance Dir, County Revenue increases 4%/yr; So your increase should also be about \$8M/yr (4%), as they say in economics, "all things being equal".

Taxes support your General Fund and Maintenance; Capital Improvements are generally by the Developer, Capital "In-Lieu" fees are required when these improvements are not made. When Developers skate free of Capital Improvements and "In-Lieu" fees, the burden falls to your BUDGET! If you do not collect the "In-Lieu" fees, you must make the developer exactions for Capital Improvements to protect your BUDGET. If not, you will end up with an unlivable community without the necessary amenities for living, ie mere wage slavery!

But: Deferred Maintenance (M_d) Expense increases Geometrically (near the point of collapse); ie $(M_d)^x$. x=time.

Goals>Strategies>Objectives>Tactics, because the Strategies you use must match your Objectives and the Objectives must be accomplishable by use of your Strategies:

Strategies (Greek, "Strategos" for General, or Army Leader) is the wrong word below "Objectives", this word should be "Tactics". "Tactics" follow "Objectives". Strategies are between "Goals" & "Objectives". Strategies are proposed and conducted by the General, taking into account the ebb and flow of battle. [The Goal is to win the war (Lead the North Bay Area); Strategies are employed by the General using natural assets and resources (men & arms: in your case; Beauty, Community, Programs, Marketing, and Media where free News Media is best. You are losing this war when reporting is of School knife and gun violence, Homelessness, etc.); Objectives are the targets of the Strategies, ie Housing and ending or reducing Homelessness are Objectives and you direct Strategies at those Objectives (Re-Zoning and Office reuse or ADU's at Housing, and Safe Parking and Permanent Supportive Housing or Over-Policing at Homelessness); Tactics are the methods of achieving Objectives, ie what type of Policing, where will the Re-Zoning take place, what Marketing or Branding will you employ. This is why you have missed out on Eco-Branding and Tourism, because you have no overarching Strategies.

The 4 Factors of Production in Economics are Land, Labor, Capital & Coordination, of which you control Coordination!

The vast majority of Economics taking place are in the Community; 60,000 homes, valued at \$60 Billion; an economy over which you have an authority to lead, but not direct responsibility. When you influence this, you succeed.

I pointed out a paradigm shift to the SC Library Dir. about their HVAC where Shade Trees & Ground Source Heat Pumps fundamentally change the energy required.

Engineering Creates Paradigm Shifts, no longer moving the chess pieces, but transforming Pawns into Queens.

My 1999 Sonoma County Economic Development Plan 2020 had 5 Parts: 3 Adopted; 2 Forgone;

Adopted: Engineering School for SSU, SMART, Internet Training for Businesses;

Forgone: Eco Tourism (Bikes, etc), Senior Housing (future housing & employment demographics).

Vision is an Image (Image in Greek is "Icon"), a picture of the future; Is your Vision of a Diminishing World? or of an Enhanced World? A Paradigm Shift is a complete shift in Vision, and it can only be brought about by Engineering (or other genius).

Then that should represent what you do for Hearn Avenue, and all your Strategies by the General; I hope, a vision of an enhanced world using a Paradigm Shift at Hearn Avenue. YHS Thomas C Ells, RCE 40656
