EDDIE ALVAREZ As you know, during the 2017 Tubbs Fire, nine residents died, 3,043 residential units were VICTORIA FLEMING destroyed displacing thousands of people from their homes, and thirty-six commercial DIANNA MACDONALD buildings were destroyed putting hundreds of people out of work. The immense CHRIS ROGERS devastation Santa Rosa faced after the 2017 fires was profound. We need to support community efforts to prevent wildfires and promote resiliency initiatives to protect our homes and wildfire.

> The City of Santa Rosa strongly supports enhancing federal assistance, including grants and tax incentives for households to build stronger and safer before disasters strike. According to the National Institute of Building Sciences, research shows that every \$1 spent on mitigation efforts leads to \$6 in reduced future disaster costs. Mitigating the disaster risk could also help with the risk-based insurance rates for these properties.
