HOME-ARP Program

- March 2021 American Rescue Plan Act established HOME-ARP program
- \$5 billion to provide housing, services, and shelter to Qualifying Populations
- FY 21/22 City awarded \$2,737,433 by U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
- City completed HUD's required consultation and public participation process and developed HOME-ARP Allocation Plan (Plan)
- February 28, 2023, Council authorized submittal of the Plan to HUD

Qualifying Populations (QP)

HOME-ARP funds must be used to benefit individuals or families who are:

- Homeless
- At-risk of homelessness
- Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence
- Other populations at risk of homelessness due to housing instability
- Veterans that meet one of the preceding criteria

- Services to start January 1, 2024
- 2 proposals received Committee on the Shelterless (COTS) and Catholic Charities

Recommendation

It is recommended by the Housing and Community Services Department that the Council, by resolution: 1) approve a Grant Agreement for the HOME-ARP Program with Committee on the Shelterless (COTS) in the amount of \$711,375 for an eighteen-month period January 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025; 2) approve a Grant Agreement for the **HOME-ARP** Program with Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Santa Rosa (CCDSR) in the amount of \$1,615,444 for an eighteen-month period January 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025; and

3) authorize the Director of Housing and Community Services to execute the grant agreements for HOME-ARP Program funds with COTS and CCDSR in the total amount of \$2,326,819.
