I have moved back to Santa Rosa after about 50 years in Healdsburg. I understand there is a huge difference between the two communities. There is one issue, however, that is glaring.... the roads.

Please don't misunderstand. Healdsburg's roads are not perfect but they are definitely better. Santa Rosa has a problem in that there isn't a freeway to carry "freeway" traffic from downtown, Coddingtown, and 101 to Hwy 12. That means that besides Hoen, there's Sonoma and Montgomery and College/4th all of which are carrying freeway loads across town.

Hoen's much better, obviously, since the recent upgrade. College/4th are okay, but Sonoma and Montgomery are abysmal. I have a suggestion that might work to improve those roadways just a bit. What if the city instituted a pothole crew that worked only at night and the only task was to fill potholes and smooth the worst of areas? This might not need to be a permanent crew but, rather, a response to small but particularly irksome...even verging on dangerous roadway conditions.

It's just a thought about how to improve travel east to west.
