

1. Describe your project, including objectives and goals, and explain how your project will meet these goals. Include who will benefit from this project and how many people it is expected to impact. Describe any approvals and permits needed and obtained for your project.

The South Park Coalition's grant request aims to support a free community event in Martin Luther King Junior Park fostering neighborhood cohesion and empowerment. The objectives include organizing an inclusive gathering featuring music, games, art, and informative sessions on safety issues by collaborating with the Santa Rosa Police Department and Santa Rosa Fire. This event will serve to strengthen community bonds, enhance neighborhood perception, and engage residents in positive activities.

Anticipated beneficiaries include residents of South Park and surrounding community, with an estimated impact on hundreds of individuals.

Necessary permits from the City of Santa Rosa's Parks Department are in progress.

2. What is your outreach plan? Explain how your project will be open and accessible to the community.

Our outreach strategy involves providing information through social media (Facebook and NextDoor), the South Park newsletter, email to residents; flyers posted in the neighborhood, neighborhood notification letters, an announcement on Press Democrat events page; and direct outreach to community organizations. The event is being held in a neighborhood park where all are welcome to attend.

3. Describe the community support for your project. What organizations, neighborhood associations, non-profits, residents, etc. are involved in the project? What roles are they playing? What other support exists for your project?

This event is supported by the volunteers of the South Park Coalition who are organizing the project.

Many local agencies and non-profits have enthusiastically supported our project, offering their resources and expertise to enhance the event's impact. The Santa Rosa Police Department and Santa Rosa File will be providing safety information. Community partners and non-profits include: Boys & Girls Club; Children's Museum of Sonoma County; Catholic Charities (housing/services for homeless); Child Parent Institute; Chimera Arts (makers' art and fabrication classes); Community Action Partnership; Conservation Corps (job training, environmental education); Council on Aging (services for seniors); Economic Development Board (business startups); Goodwill (job training); Head Start (preschool); InResponse (mental health services); Landpaths (connects kids/people with nature); Latino Service Providers

(services for Latin community); Legal Aid (legal services); NextGen Trade Academy (job training/internships); Nuestra Comunidad (disaster preparedness); Positive Images (LGBTQ services); Providence Health (health screenings); Recology (recycling services); Redwood Empire Food Bank (food); Santa Rosa Junior College (education); Sonoma County Library; Social Advocates for Youth (youth services); Sonoma 4cs (childcare enrollment, preschool); Sonoma County Animal Shelter (animal adoption program); Sonoma County Regional Parks; Sonoma Ecology Center; YWCA (domestic violence help).

Each participating organization will provide valuable information and resources available to community members. These include safety and disaster preparedness information; job training and internship opportunities; environmental education, cultural enhancement, education enrollment; kids' activities, economic development, legal and mental health services, and more.

In addition to these community partners, we also have the support of our City Councilman Eddie Alvarez, Mayor Natalie Rogers, County Supervisor Chris Coursey, and the Parks, Fire, and Police Department.

The overwhelming support from these entities demonstrates a strong foundation for the project, indicating widespread community backing.

# 4. Is there ongoing maintenance required for your project? If so, what is the plan for maintenance and who is going to be responsible?

No on-going maintenance is required. Post-event cleanup and coordination will be promptly managed by volunteers from the South Park Coalition to ensure the sustained positive impact of the event on the neighborhood. We will partner with Recology to process recycling, trash, and compost bins.

# 5. Projects should reflect environmental consciousness regarding materials, energy, and conservation. Please describe how your project will meet this goal.

Our project aligns with environmental consciousness principles by prioritizing sustainable practices throughout its execution. This includes minimizing waste generation and the use of sustainable materials from vendors through responsible event planning. We will be incorporating educational components focused on environmental conservation with our partners Recology, Sonoma Ecology Center, and Conservation Corp.

6. Please provide a brief statement on how you will keep project participants safe during implementation (e.g. social distancing protocols, gloves, masks, etc.).

We will adhere to safety guidelines, including the use of hand sanitizers and regular sanitization of shared spaces. Additionally, designated personnel will be available to address any safety concerns promptly.

7. Project Budget: Grant requests may not exceed \$2,500. Please explain how the requested funds will be used, how the cost estimate was determined and the status of matching funds. This section is supplemental information to the Cost Estimate Form.

The South Park Coalition's grant request totaling \$2,500 will be used to maximize the impact of the community event. The majority of the grant will cover expenses related to hiring local performers. The funds will also cover the purchase of necessary supplies such as art materials, game equipment, and prizes to enhance participant engagement, and sanitizers and gloves for safety protocols. Funds will cover some of the costs associated with promotional materials such as flyers, banners, and event signage.

The cost estimate was determined by researching pricing for event essentials and supplies. Additionally, historical data from our past community events was reviewed to ensure realistic budget projections.

The South Park Coalition has matching funds totaling \$9,150. This includes:

**Project Title: SOFA Arts District Outdoor Gallery** 

Today's Date: March 28, 2024

#### **Description:**

The nine artists renting studio space in the Studios on A building, 312 South A St., Santa Rosa 95401, propose an outdoor public arts mural project that celebrates the community, expressing the creative exuberance of the SOFA Arts District neighborhood. The mural title will be the 'SOFA Arts District Outdoor Gallery'.

#### **Objectives:**

The building at 312 South A St. is already well known as a hub of the arts scene in Santa Rosa. Monthly First Friday Open Studios, gallery openings and special events hosted by the Santa Rosa Arts Center, which is a tenant in the building, and annual neighborhood-wide events such as Winterblast already draw hundreds of visitors every year. The mural's objective is to expand the artistic offerings available in the the SOFA Arts District neighborhood, further raising its profile and enhancing its status as a vibrant neighborhood and an artistic and cultural asset to the entire Santa Rosa community.

#### Location:

The mural will be located along Art Alley and will be painted on the south facing wall of 312 South A Street. Art Alley runs east and west between South A St. and Julliard Park Dr. It is open to vehicle and pedestrian traffic and originates on South A St. between 312 and 318 South A. See Map.

#### **Concept:**

The concept for the mural is to create an art gallery scene that would be colorful, whimsical, and fun with painted sofas and chairs (reinforcing our identity as the SOFA, or South of A Street, district) along with images of framed artwork hanging over the seating elements. SOFA is often identified with the annual Winterblast celebration. Therefore, the sofas will be rolling as if they were in Winterblast's SOFA Parade. The Art Alley wall is approximately 108 feet long. We envision up to 10 sofas with a corresponding number of 'artworks', so we expect to be able to showcase a broad cross-section of local artists and their work. Our plan is to issue a Call for Artists that will go out to the entire Sonoma County community. The artists will submit their proposed designs for the sofas and 'artwork'. The Call for Artists will include a requirement that the artwork address the theme of diversity in some way. A selection committee will select from the submitted designs and notify the artists of the results. Artists with selected work will then paint their compositions on polytab fabric and deliver them to SOFA. SOFA artists working with other volunteers will then apply the polytab compositions to the wall.

#### **Project Goals:**

1. To enhance the appearance of what is now a 108 foot long, approximately 1700 square foot concrete wall on Art Alley. Art Alley is a main thoroughfare within the SOFA neighborhood.

- 2. To demonstrate the talent of the local arts community as well as its commitment that art is both for and about everybody from all walks of life. Viewing Art Alley is free and it's accessible around the clock, 24 hours a day.
- 3. To express the Santa Rosa community's diversity by incorporating a broad range of artistic styles and subjects that emphasize the community's inherited and acquired identities. We expect to involve a diverse group of up to 20 artists who will volunteer their time to create artworks which will be selected in part by the creativity with which they address diversity in their designs.

#### **Approvals and Permits:**

- We have obtained the approval of the building owner, Amador Properties. See attached.
- We will apply for a Special Use Permit from the city of Santa Rosa. This will be needed to close Art Alley to vehicle traffic during mural application as well as during the Grand Opening Celebration.

#### **Outreach Plan**

The call for Artists will be disseminated broadly throughout the county. The resulting Outdoor Gallery mural will be accessible to the entire community free of charge, 24 hours a day. It is open to vehicle and pedestrian traffic. We will use our SOFA Facebook and Instagram channels to spread the project news. The social media campaign will be used to build excitement leading up to the installation through work in process photographs, artist profiles, etc. We'll also take steps to provide the local and Bay Area media with information.

Once we have a completion date scheduled, we will plan an opening celebration that will also be broadly advertised and that will be free of charge and open to all. A good time to do this would be during one of our First Friday evening events when most of the studios are open to the public.

#### **Community Support:**

Our project is supported by the entire SOFA neighborhood which includes over 20 artist studios, restaurants including Spinster Sisters and Café Frida, the Astro Motel, the Santa Rosa Arts Center, with its over 200 members and very active cadre of volunteers, the award winning Imaginists Theater, and several unique shops and small businesses. Historically SOFA has also been supported by outside donors such as Riley Street and Dierk's Café.

For this project we look forward to working closely with the Santa Rosa Urban Arts Partnership, a local 501-3c that advocates for Julliard Park and that has managed SOFA's Winterblast celebration the last two years. The Santa Rosa Urban Arts Partnership has offered to serve as a fiscal sponsor for this project and the A Street Artists are actively exploring this opportunity.

#### **Ongoing Maintenance**

The nine artists renting space in the 312 South A Street building will coordinate efforts with the property owner, Amador Properties, to perform ongoing maintenance of the project. This maintenance will be minimal in the first few years but may eventually involve repair or

replacement of some of the artwork. Durable acrylic paint will be used by the artists. The artwork will be sealed with a product suitable for outdoor murals. We also plan to apply an antigraffitti coating. Expenses related to mural maintenance will be the responsibility of the propoerty owner and the A Street Artists studio tenents.

#### **Environmental Factors**

All materials used will be water based. Leftover paint will be retained for touch up purposes or recycled through PaintCare.

#### Safety

The paint materials will be non-toxic. However, we will make gloves and masks available to those who want them. As mentioned above, Art Alley will be closed off to vehicle traffic during working hours. We plan to rent sturdy scaffolding and ladders.







# Rising of 606 Santa Rosa Avenue!

#### Describe Project

My name is DeVonne Hart. I own Santa Rosa Garden Supply and Hydroponics at 606 Santa Rosa

Avenue in the Luther Burbank Garden District. I recently graduated from California State University

Dominguez Hills, receiving a bachelor's degree in Entrepreneurship with a minor in Africana Studies. I

moved to Santa Rosa this summer after I acquired the business, which had stagnated for some years,
after receiving seed money from notable collegiate pitch competitions nationwide. As a young, Black
male, born and raised in the Bay Area, I am excited to embark on my professional career here in Santa
Rosa. The central goal of "Rising of 606 Santa Rosa Avenue!" is to LIFT my piece of the Santa Rosa

Avenue business strip. The strip is home to a motley crew of industries, not traditionally focused on
the exterior look of their buildings, including a pawn shop, smoke shop, tattoo parlor, RV and car
dealerships, paint store, auto sales, etc.—all evident, providing a particular image of Santa Rosa to those
driving into and out of downtown. Since this summer, I have been reaching out to neighbors,
community groups, business owners, city departments, etc., to elevate my business's appearance, but
my limited resources have restricted me.

In recent months, a neighbor has assisted me in developing larger ambitions for my business, one being to present the best face possible for my business's exterior. Given the new landscaping on Santa Rosa Avenue, these ambitions are perfectly timed, which will transform the business strip! I want to join the Santa Rosa Avenue "facelift." To meet this goal, "*Rising of 606 Santa Rosa Avenue*" is a three-part application:

- 1. Mural Arts on my 606 Santa Rosa Avenue building. This mural will have a theme of biodiversity focused on images of different native plants;
- 2. Landscaping in front of 606 Santa Rosa Avenue. In concert with the mural, the landscaping will provide color, smells, visual beauty, and a natural habitat for various life;
- **3. Garden Party** at 606 Santa Rosa Avenue. This garden party will invite the community to view the finished mural, enjoy the new landscaping, and meet members of the Santa Rosa community.

Objectives and Goals: This project's primary objectives and goals target the feel, look, and experience along Santa Rosa Avenue by engaging all of the human senses by installing a mural on the side and front of 606 Santa Rosa Avenue, improving the landscaping, including with the installation of raised beds with drought tolerant native plants in front of the shop where drivers and pedestrians will benefit from the softening and beautifying of my piece of the strip. A neighbor has already donated the installation of 4 trees, one metal raised bed with soil, and some plants to support my ambitions. However, there is far more significant work to do that requires more resources.

Who Benefits?: Santa Rosa Avenue is a major thoroughfare leading to downtown Santa Rosa. Santa Rosa Avenue is a busy street with thousands of people walking and commuting north and south daily. These citizens utilize the bus routes, bike lanes, roads, and sidewalks. This project could impact thousands of people traveling along Santa Rosa Avenue daily.

Moreover, the city's improvements to the street median, which provides a walkway directly to Santa Rosa Garden Supply, would complement the work the city has been doing to provide a more walkable and bikeable experience traveling along Santa Rosa Avenue. Every business along Santa Rosa Avenue can contribute to improving Santa Rosa Avenue. Murals provide an immediate uplifting energy, noticeable with the mural on Mike Chavez's Painting business and the murals around El Roy's Express Mex food truck parking lot. The neighborhoods of Luther Burbank Garden District and the Arts District would both experience significant benefits from the additional mural and garden arts since the neighborhoods highlight residents' relationships to the arts and the gardens!

Required Approvals: I have obtained permission from my landlord to make additions to the murals and

landscaping of the property.

We will reach out to community members via social media, posters, local organizations, and word of mouth. This project will be open and accessible to all residents and visitors of Santa Rosa who use Santa Rosa Avenue as their transit line to patronize local businesses, attend community attractions such as Luther Burbank Gardens and Julliard Park, or head in/out of downtown, to direct neighbors who view the Santa Rosa business strip daily.

# Community Support for Project

You will find Petitions of Support for this project signed by residential neighbors, local business owners, customers, and local artists. Different neighbors have offered significant donations, such as one local builder who has agreed to provide construction supplies such as ladders, tools, etc. He has also donated the building and installing of metal raised beds. Another has promised a delivery of soil and mulch. Another neighbor has organized neighbors to offer cash donations and volunteer time to prepare the building for painting, landscaping, and cleaning up. Another neighbor has agreed to donate her time to organize the Garden Party. A local artist has agreed to provide a digital sketch of the mural to properly prepare for the painting of the mural, while The Mural Project is interested in painting the mural. Other support is from local businesses, such as donating wood chips and cement hauling of removed concrete. I have a good balance of participation/project support from local businesses, neighbors/residents, and local art groups. Lastly, \$600 in cash donations have been committed from local neighbors.

# Maintenance Requirements

As the owner, I will keep up with the maintenance of the mural and garden installations. Expectations for mural upkeep will be minimal for many years. The plan is to prep the site very well and use high-quality materials as insurance for a highly durable mural. The landscaping that will be placed will have an eye toward low/manageable upkeep. The responsibility for the mural art and garden art will be mine as the business owner who is onsite every day.

## **Environmental Consciousness**

The landscape design plan is in alignment with tenets for conservation and biodiversity. The four trees planted just weeks ago to maximize the benefits of winter rains will provide valuable habitat for local bird species and other small critters and offer opportunities currently missing for pollination. The proposed ground landscaping, including sage and salvias, will provide habitat and food for various critters. The goal of the overall project is to cool my area of Santa Rosa Avenue, via adding canopy, ground cover, and raised plants along the city sidewalks and making nature immediately accessible, especially for pedestrians, bikers, and commuters who would benefit the most.

This proposal's strength is its numerous donations of construction materials, so very few materials need to be purchased. The project will use high-quality paint for the site prep and mural installation – ensuring the longevity of the mural. Furthermore, the project will seek out the most environmentally safe painting supplies. We will collaborate with The Mural Project, which has already been entrusted to do many other murals in Santa Rosa. All work will be done outside, so we will not need to use any utilities, except in the limited situations where tools will need electricity.

#### Project Safety

All the work of this project will be completed outside, so the risk of COVID-19 infection is minimal, if non-existent. The nature of the project requires that project participants work in duos or small groups, which limits risk. Volunteers donating their time will be required to wear protective clothing, such as solid shoes and garden gloves, to minimize or eliminate injury that may result from gardening and clean-up activities. Volunteers will be required to sign a form attesting to compliance with safety guidelines.

# **Explanation of Budget**

The total amount budgeted for this project is \$6568.20.

Mural Arts Component: A budget of \$4023 has been budgeted for mural arts. \$1403 has been promised in donated project materials rentals such as ladders, tarps, tools, power washer, etc. Valuations were based on calls to Action Rentals for the costs of daily and weekly rentals of listed donated equipment/materials. \$1600 requested plus \$600 has been promised in cash donations from neighbors that will be used toward providing payment to The Mural Project. (Estimated fees for mural work can range from \$15 to \$20 a sq foot). \$550 has been requested for paint based on an estimate of \$120 per 5 gallon of paint. It is expected that the project will obtained donated and/or heavily discounted paint to extend project resources. In addition, \$70 has been promised for time put toward developing a digital sketch that will be used to inform the final conceptual design.

Landscaping Component: A total of \$2002.40 has been budgeted for the landscaping component of this project. \$2145.20 of the budget has been promised for materials, including equipment that would be loaned to the project by a local carpenter (dolley, wheelbarrow, misc. tools). Valuations were based on daily/weekly rental amounts given by Action Rentals. A local carpenter provided the estimate cost of the donated raised beds, estimated at \$621.40, \$400 for material costs (metal, wood, misc.), plus 10 hours of his labor at \$22.14 (his regular hourly fee is \$100/hr.) for construction of the metal raised beds, moving the raised beds from his shop to 606 Santa Rosa Avenue, and installing the raised beds. Estimates for the valuation of the delivery of soil/mulch and woodchips were made by calling a local landscaping supply company. Gaona, a local cement contractor, donated cement hauling for cement removed for landscaping. Funds requested for the landscaping component were minimal: \$100 for a new hose and \$200 for salvias, sages, and other native plants, estimated at 20 plants at \$10 per plant. (\$1160 in landscaping materials (4 trees, raised beds, soil, and plants) were recently donated and installed to take advantage of winter rains but were not included in final grant budget amounts.) Garden Party Component: A total of \$100 has been budgeted for the Garden Party. A garden party would be held to share the results of this project with members of the community. Non-alcoholic drinks and sweets would be served. We were promised \$50 in donated refreshments and requested \$50 to supplement these donations.

#### Other: Volunteer hours

In addition, we obtained commitments from four neighbors, all agreeing to provide a minimum of 5 hours each of volunteer hours at \$22.14/hr. for a total of \$442.80.


